

Visits with a nurse are voluntary and free.

We support caregivers by connecting them to resources, providing education on topics such as pregnancy, childbirth, parenting, infant feeding, bonding, and their child's growth and development.

Our primary focus is prenatal through age 5.

Our electronic referral form is the preferred method to refer. It features smart logic, whether you are self-referring or referring someone else to save you time.



FAMILY FEEDBACK SURVEY RESULTS


Our annual Family Feedback Survey is distributed to all families currently enrolled in our home visiting program across our four counties. Responses are voluntary and anonymous. This year, we received 132 family responses. 87% of responses were in English, 13% were in Spanish.



92% of respondents reported high likelihood to recommend family home visiting to other families.



100% of families expressed improvement in one or more areas of life since beginning home visiting.





FAMILY FEEDBACK SURVEY RESULTS

How has our family home visiting and/or your nurse impacted your life?

Honestly, I have no idea what I would have done without my home [visiting] nurse. Being a young mom for the first time was very scary and [my nurse] held my hand and made me feel supported every step from pregnancy, to labor, breastfeeding, navigating motherhood, toddler behavior and so on.

[My Home Visitor] has done a great job with providing our family with additional support and resources as we navigate being new parents. She has been very helpful in all aspects.

OUTREACH & EVENTS

Together we do more! Here are a few ways our teams have built connections in our communities this past quarter and got the word out about family home visiting (FHV):

- Staff presented about FHV at a Wright County Early Head Start's Family Socialization event.
- First Steps Program Manager was appointed to the statewide Maternal Child Health Task Force's FHV Subcommittee for a four year term.
- Staff participated with MN Legal Aid and Project Care in a Healthcare For All event in Elk River to connect underserved individuals and families with health insurance and resources.
- Staff participated at CentraCare's Community Baby Shower event in St. Cloud.
- Staff continued work with local health systems to educate staff, reduce barriers, and create efficiencies in referral workflow in order to connect more families to FHV.
- Staff assist at some of the weekly drop-in infant feeding support groups in central MN (see blue box below for details about days and times).
- Staff attend monthly THRIVE Central MN meetings with other early childhood professionals to promote healthy relationships and secure connections for our youngest children in Central MN.



The Supporting Steps Program is currently being piloted for Wright County families only



What is it?

This free home visiting program provides a nurse and licensed alcohol and drug counselor (LADC) to support pregnant and postpartum people, caregivers, and families who have concerns about substance use, currently use substances, or have a history of substance use.

Participation is voluntary. The nurse and LADC will support you to reach your goals and design the life you want for yourself and your family.

What should I expect?

The nurse and LADC will meet you separately in a mutually agreed upon setting- it could be your home or a different location in the community. Telehealth options are also available.

The counselor will meet with you at least once per month while the nurse may meet with you more frequently. Visit discussion is led by you and may include:

- Your and your family's health
- Your goals
- Child growth and development
- Parenting skills
- Tools to help reduce substance use and avoid recurrence
- Local resources and supports

Who is eligible to participate?

Pregnant/expecting parents or parents/caregivers who have a history of or are actively using a substance, or are receiving Medication-Assisted Treatment. Participant must live in Wright County.
