A warm welcome to our winter newsletter! Thank you for reading our newsletter to stay up to date with new information. We also thank all of our community partners who referred families to us in 2021. Parents now, more than ever, need these connections, supports, skills, and education. Along with home visiting, public health continues to offer a variety of programs and resources for our communities including car seat distribution & education, immunization clinics, the Follow Along Program, WIC, and more! Our nurses are knowledgeable about community resources and will connect families to those resource that might be helpful to them.

In 2022, we will have a greater focus on outreach to our community partners. We hope to surpass our monthly referral numbers from years past. This includes maintaining our relationships with past referral sources, as well as building new connections, to serve more families in need. We are happy to schedule a time with you to learn how we can partner and better support families in Central MN. During the past few months, our teams have grown. Our newest home visiting nurses are eager to be trained in MECSH and take on their own caseloads. Our seasoned nurses continue to grow their caseloads. Also, in late Spring 2022, we will be applying for the next round of grant funds to support our collaborative family home visiting work in central MN.

You can make a referral to us by downloading and completing our referral form from our website then faxing it in to 763-765-4250. Or you can give us a call at 763-276-0441 to relay the referral information. Home visits with a personal nurse are provided at no cost to families and are always voluntary. Our MECSH (pronounced 'mesh') home visits continue in-person, but do have both phone and telehealth options available as well.



### FIRST STEPS CENTRAL MN

is a team of Registered Nurses from Benton, Sherburne, Stearns, and Wright County Public Health who offer free support, advice and information to have a healthy pregnancy, a healthy baby, and be a great parent by providing free, voluntary in-home family home visiting services utilizing evidencebased programming to eligible families.

Our Nurses help promote healthy birth outcomes and positive parentinfant relationships, encourage healthy growth and development for infants and young children, prevent complications of illness and chronic disease conditions, promote healthy and safe environments, and encourage family self-sufficiency and linkage to community resources.

### FOCUS POPULATION


- Pregnant or newly postpartum
- Low income (WIC or MA eligible)
- Live in Benton, Sherburne, Stearns or Wright County

We also want to connect with families who may have:


- Financial or housing insecurities
- Interest in infant feeding or breastfeeding support
- Limited support system
- Limited parenting skills
- Received late prenatal care or have been inconsistent with attending appointments
- Have a history of or current abuse, safety concerns, violence, mental health concerns, chemical or tobacco use or abuse

### Data Dive 2021 REVIEW

Community Partners



FS centralized intake process has been in place for 2 years and over 1400 referrals have come through for the region. FS Personal Nurses reach out to all referrals to offer family home visiting and connect families to resources. Over 70% of these referrals reached are interested in family home visiting. FS Personal Nurses are also available to answer immediate questions or provide referrals to other services as needed.





### **Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI)**

We are in the middle of a CQI project focused on client engagement and initial referral calls. In December 2021, we provided a staff survey to compile baseline data. Based on survey results, we have been developing various tools and other plans to best support staff needs when it comes to engaging families and doing outreach with partners. This has also helped with communication and transparency across the collaborative.

Our first project focus was to develop a Best Practice Guide which includes best practice tips and sample scripts for staff to reference. Topics covered in the Best Practice Guide include: initial engagement of referrals, continuous engagement of enrolled families, working with interpreters and non-English speaking families, outreach to community partners, and use of our branded materials and logo. This is a helpful tool for not only new staff, but also our more experienced nurses.

Next, we will begin planning a Community of Practice, or other learning/training opportunity for staff team-building and expanding learning across the region. Then, a follow-up survey will be provided to staff in late spring/early summer to gather additional data and will create potential for follow-up collaborative projects.

### **Community Partner Best Practice Tips & Talking Points**

### **Word Choice**

- Use the phrase "personal nurse" instead of "public health nurse" or "county nurse."
- Use "First Steps" instead of "Benton, Sherburne, Stearns, Wright, or the County."
- Normalize the referral by saying "I refer all families to First Steps."

### Reminders

- A nurse will follow up with a phone call to the family within a few days to share more information.
- We are a voluntary support for families. Please ask the family for permission to refer.
- There is no fee to families to participate.

### Sample Script:

"I would like to connect you to a personal nurse through First Steps. I like to refer all of my patients to them. They are a team of nurses who work with families during pregnancy and after baby is born. They can provide additional support and connection to resources as you go through your pregnancy and bring baby home. Are you okay if I ask for a nurse to give you a call in the next couple of days to talk more?"

Car Seat Checks
(available to any Benton County residents, by appt only)

Find out if yours is right...Child Passenger Safety Specialists can answer questions regarding child safety seats and check your car seats. At a check, seats are evaluated for: defects, recall listings, suitability for the age of the child, and fit with the safety belt system in the vehicle. To get your child safety seats checked, call the number above to set up an appointment with a Benton County CPS technician. Please allow 30 minutes for EACH seat to be checked.









### Car Seat Distribution

### Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be a Benton County resident.
- ✓ Specific state health plan enrolled families are eligible to receive a car seat at no cost. (families who are on WIC or children on Medical Assistance are automatically eligible).
  - If your child has BluePlus or Health Partners insurance, you will need to call Milestones at 320-251-5081 to schedule an appointment.
  - If your child has a health plan different from the ones listed above or is uninsured, please call Benton County at 320-968-5087 to schedule an appointment.

### MONTHLY CAR SEAT DISTRIBUTION

Attend one of our classes to receive a new child safety seat and instruction on proper use and installation.

### Eligibility:

- Sherburne County families can receive a car seat for a \$20 donation. Call to find out income guidelines. Families receiving WIC or Medical Assistance are automatically eligible.
- Minnesota Health Care Program Health Partners and Blue Plus members can receive a car seat at no cost. Call for age guidelines.
