## **UPDATES**

As our Evidence-Based Home Visiting Expansion Grant Award comes to an end in December, we have some good news to share! Each of our First Steps Central MN counties were awarded MDH's Strong Foundations Grant, to begin January 1, 2023. These grant funds will provide support to sustain each of our county's evidence based family home visiting programs for the next five year grant cycle, as well as maintain the current structure of our collaborative work across the region with support from our Regional Family Home Visiting Program Manager and Data & Analytics Manager. Benton, Sherburne, Stearns & Wright Counties look forward to continuing our collaborative work together and partnering with additional community resources to best support Central MN families. Family home visiting program outcomes include improved maternal and child health, increased family economic self-sufficiency, promotion of optimal child development, and prevention of child abuse and neglect.

Maternal Early Childhood Sustained Home Visiting, or MECSH (pronounced 'mesh'), is our primary evidence-based home visiting program. Additional MECSH-specific trial outcomes:

- New mothers, who experienced a normal, unassisted vaginal birth, felt significantly more enabled and confident to:
  - care for themselves and their baby
  - had significantly better self-rated health
  - could name two or more measures to reduce SIDS/SUIDs
- Children had:
  - better health
  - lower rates of respiratory infections
  - were breastfed longer
  - had improved cognitive development
  - were more engaged with their mother
- · Mothers of infants and toddlers had:
  - a better experience being a mother
  - provided an organized home environment supportive of their child's development with improved verbal and emotional responsiveness
  - provided developmentally appropriate play materials
  - had greater parental involvement

- 3-5 during pregnancy
- Weekly initially after deliver
- Transition to less frequent thereafter

## FAMILY STORY SPOTLIGHT

When I first became a mother, I had the option to work with a Public Health Nurse, so I decided to sign up without knowing what the program offered. I didn't know how much of a lifeline this program and Karmen would be while learning to be a mother. When I first met with Karmen, she explained what the program offered and how it could help. At the time, I was under the impression that I would have the help of my child's father, and my closest family and friends. However, as my belly got bigger, life took some unexpected turns. No matter who wasn't there to help me, Karmen was.

Karmen and I started our sessions via Zoom in the middle of the COVID Pandemic. During that time, I started to experience the true nature of my child's father. Many times I didn't know who I should be getting involved in the situations whether that's the police, the hospital, Child Protective Services, or Wright County. At our meetings, Karmen would walk me through the next stages of my pregnancy, but also, the next steps to keep my child and I safe. The environment of our meetings allowed me to bring any and all questions about pregnancy, motherhood, and life as a mother. Every question was answered without judgment and to the best of Karmen's ability which created a safe space for me. Eventually, the chaos of change died down, and our next goal was to welcome Octavia into this world and get her to latch.

Before Octavia was born, Karmen and I went over breastfeeding umpteen times. We discussed methods, products to use, what to expect, and how to prevent the unwanted. Our discussions gave me the confidence to move forward with my goal of breastfeeding even though there was much left to learn and none of my closest family and friends had ever experienced it. Once Octavia was born, for the next six months and remainder of my breastfeeding journey, Karmen was there whenever I needed her to help troubleshoot the situation. I had an amazing experience breastfeeding and will do the same with my future children. The encouragement I received to push through breastfeeding obstacles gave me the confidence to continue to push through any and all obstacles that would get in the way of me being a good mother.

As Octavia got older, life continued to throw curveballs and overnight I became a true single mother. Everything Karmen and I had discussed about motherhood now became vital to our success. At the time it felt as if my world was melting, and the only thing that was left at the end of the day was my daughter and I. We stood strong because of the support of Karmen provided from pregnancy to two years old. She taught me how to care for my child, and how to trust myself as a mother. At the time I began this program, I didn't know that all I would be learning would be essential while transitioning into a full-time single mother.






