- The remaining pages will typically include flyers and information about events and opportunities to meet other parents and grow additional parenting skills across our central MN region.



Family Feedback Survey

Each fall, we ask all families current enrolled in our home visiting program across our four First Steps counties to participate in our Family Feedback Survey. Responses are voluntary and anonymous. This year, we received 147 family responses to the survey, which included questions for families to share how they felt about their home visiting program experience and the positive impact it is having on their life. What is ECFE?

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is a family education program that provides programming and services for families with children between the ages of birth to Kindergarten.

Learning opportunities may occur in a variety of settings, such as the families' homes, district or community sites, and online parenting education and support. Classes often include parent discussion time; joint parent and child activities; and children learning and play time. Programming can vary by school district.

Eligibility

All Minnesota caregivers of children from birth to kindergarten enrollment. ECFE offers sliding scale fees. No family is turned away due to inability to pay.

- The Stearns First Steps team welcomed two Public Health Nurses in late 2025--Lucy & Tamara!
- We average 80 incoming referrals to family home visiting each month!
 - Approximately one-third (34%) of our referrals are prenatal.
- We are currently serving 373 families in our family home visiting program across Benton, Sherburne, Stearns & Wright Counties.
- There are an average of 652 visitors to our First Steps Central MN website each month.
- Our First Steps staff have a total of 337 years of public health experience collectively.




