A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 5 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 libraries, so as to prohibit the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, and 3 city, county, and regional public library trustees from using any public or privately donated 4 funds on any materials, services, or operations offered by the American Library Association 5 or any of its affiliates; to amend Chapter 80 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia 6 Annotated, relating to provisions applicable to counties, municipal corporations, and other 7 governmental entities, so as to prohibit taxpayer or privately donated funds from going to the 8 American Library Association or any of its affiliates; to amend Title 43 of the Official Code 9 of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses, so as to repeal Chapter 24, 10 relating to librarians, so as to dissolve the state board for the certification of librarians and 11 remove certification and continuing education requirements; to amend Part 1 of Article 3 of 12 Chapter 5 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general 13 authority, duties, and procedure of the Department of Administrative Services, so as to 14 prohibit the acceptance of any bid or proposal made by the American Library Association 15 for a state contract; to provide for legislative findings; to provide for an effective date; to 16 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 19 The General Assembly finds the following:
- 20 (1) The present state requirement that only certified librarians may work as librarians at
- 21 public libraries has not benefitted the residents of this state;
- 22 (2) The bureaucracy that has developed around the certification of librarians has become
- 23 heavily intertwined with and influenced by the American Library Association;
- 24 (3) The President of the American Library Association has declared herself to be a
- 25 Marxist;
- 26 (4) The American Library Association has used the librarian certification process to
- 27 promote its ideology;
- 28 (5) The vast majority of residents of this state do not want their tax dollars to directly or
- 29 indirectly support such an ideology;
- 30 (6) The Georgia Library Association is an affiliate of the American Library Association;
- 31 (7) The Georgia Library Association should no longer be an affiliate of the American
- 32 Library Association;
- 33 (8) Other states have begun reducing the influence of the American Library Association;
- 34 (9) Some states do not require the certification of librarians working at public libraries;
- 35 and
- 36 (10) This state should no longer require the certification of librarians working at public
- 37 libraries or allow public moneys to be used to support the American Library Association.

38 SECTION 2.

- 39 Chapter 5 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to libraries, is
- 40 amended in subsections (a) and (b) of Code Section 20-5-2 as follows:
- 41 "(a) The board of regents shall give aid, advice, and counsel to all libraries and to
- 42 communities which may propose to establish libraries as to the best means of establishing
- 43 and administering them, the selection of books, cataloging, and other details of library

44 management and shall exercise supervision over all public libraries and endeavor to 45 improve libraries already established. The board of regents may also conduct a 46 book-lending and information service for the benefit of the citizens of the state, free of cost 47 except postage. The board of regents is also authorized to purchase books, periodicals, and 48 other instructional materials for such purposes. The board of regents may also employ 49 necessary professional and clerical staff to carry on the work as stated in this Code section 50 and may pay their necessary traveling expenses while engaged in such work. The board of regents shall not use any public funds on any materials, services, or operations offered 51 52 by the American Library Association or any of its affiliates. 53 (b) The board of regents shall have authority to accept gifts of books, money, or other 54 property from any public or private source, including the federal government, and shall 55 have authority to perform any and all functions necessary to carry out the intention and 56 purposes of this article. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no such gifts 57 shall be provided to the American Library Association or any of its affiliates."

58 SECTION 3.

Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 20-5-20, relating to power of city to tax and appropriate and election of trustees to control library funds, as follows:

- 61 "20-5-20.
- Any city, through its properly constituted municipal authorities, may raise by taxation from
- year to year and permanently appropriate money for the purpose of establishing, erecting,
- maintaining, or assisting in maintaining a public library. Any such sum or sums of money
- so appropriated shall be expended by and under the direction of a board of trustees of such
- 66 public library elected by the city council of such city. Notwithstanding any provision of
- 67 <u>law to the contrary, no such sum or sums of money shall be provided to the American</u>
- 68 <u>Library Association or any of its affiliates.</u>"

69 SECTION 4.

70 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 20-5-44, relating to compensation

- 71 of trustees, as follows:
- 72 "20-5-44.
- 73 Members of the board of trustees shall receive no compensation; provided, however, that
- such members may be reimbursed for any reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in
- 75 the performance of library business or if stipulated in terms of any bequest or gift. Dues
- or fees for membership in local, state, regional, and national library associations may be
- paid from operating funds in accordance with the constitution and bylaws of the library
- 78 system. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, dues or fees for membership
- 79 in the American Library Association shall not be paid from such funds or any other public
- 80 moneys."

SECTION 5.

- 82 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 20-5-45, relating to directors of
- 83 library systems, duties, and responsibilities, as follows:
- 84 "20-5-45.
- 85 Every public library system shall have a director. Any person appointed as director of a
- 86 public library system must hold at least a Grade 5(b) Librarian's Professional Graduate
- 87 Certificate, as defined by the State Board for the Certification of Librarians; provided,
- 88 however, that any person who was serving as acting director of a public library system as
- 89 of July 1, 1984, shall be authorized to continue to serve as director. The director shall be
- appointed by the board of trustees and shall be the administrative head of the library system
- 91 under the direction and review of the board. The director of a library system shall have
- 92 duties and responsibilities which include but are not limited to the following:

93 (1) To recommend for employment or termination other staff members, as necessary, in

- compliance with applicable laws and the availability of funds and to employ or terminate
- other staff members if so authorized by the library board;
- 96 (2) To attend all meetings called by the Office of Public Library Services of the Board
- of Regents of the University System of Georgia or send a substitute authorized by the
- 98 office director;
- 99 (3) To prepare any local, state, or federal annual budgets;
- 100 (4) To notify the board of trustees and the Office of Public Library Services of the Board
- of Regents of the University System of Georgia of any failure to comply with:
- 102 (A) Policies of the board;
- 103 (B) Criteria for state aid;
- (C) State and federal rules and regulations; and
- (D) All applicable local, state, or federal laws;
- 106 (5) To administer the total library program, including all affiliated libraries, in
- accordance with policies adopted by the system board of trustees; and
- 108 (6) To attend all meetings of the system board of trustees and affiliated boards of trustees
- or to designate a person to attend in his or her place."

110 SECTION 6.

- 111 Said chapter is further amended by repealing Code Section 20-5-56, relating to requirement
- 112 of certification of librarians, and designating said Code section as reserved.

SECTION 7.

- 114 Chapter 80 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to provisions
- 115 applicable to counties, municipal corporations, and other governmental entities, is amended
- 116 by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

- 117 "36-80-32.
- No county, municipality, school district, authority, division, instrumentality, political
- subdivision, or public body corporate created under the Constitution or laws of this state
- shall be authorized to use any taxpayer or privately donated funds on materials, services,
- or operations offered by the American Library Association or any of its affiliates."
- 122 SECTION 8.
- 123 Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses,
- 124 is amended by repealing Chapter 24, relating to librarians, and designating said chapter as
- 125 reserved.
- 126 SECTION 9.
- 127 Part I of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 128 relating to general authority, duties, and procedure of the Department of Administrative
- 129 Services, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 130 "50-5-84.3
- 131 The Department of Administrative Services shall not accept any bid or proposal made by
- the American Library Association or any of its affiliates for a state contract."
- 133 **SECTION 10.**
- 134 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2025.
- 135 **SECTION 11.**
- 136 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
