Where can I take wedding photos nearby?

One of the questions we get asked the most here at Storehouse 408!

Those who know Hespeler already know about some of the most beautiful areas in our own neighbourhood. But if you're not familiar with the area, you may not know that you don't need to go far to get unique and stunning wedding photos, at any time of year.

The following locations are a compilation of the most photo-worthy backdrops in Hespeler, all within less than 5 minutes of Storehouse 408.

MILL RUN TRAIL

Highlights

This woodland trail runs along the Speed River from the Sheffield Street trailhead under Highway 401 to Riverside Park, connecting Hespeler to Preston.

It follows the 1896 Galt, Preston, Hespeler Electric Railway Line passing through Chilligo Conservation area and the former Idylwild Park. The trail surface is mainly stone dust with stretches of boardwalks offering a footbridge crossing and river vistas. The area is alive with deer, beaver, ducks, geese, heron and numerous songbirds.

Location and directions

Distance from venue: 4 minutes

Address: 200 Sheffield St. Cambridge, ON.

Directions: From Storehouse 408 parking lot, turn Right on Queen St. W. At main intersection, turn Left on Guelph Ave. Turn Left of Sheffield St. until the end. Parking available at entrance to trail.











THE HESPELER FURNITURE CO.

Highlights

The Hespeler Furniture Company was founded in 1901 in Hespeler, Ontario by Mr. George A. Gruetzner, originally from Buffalo, N.Y. He worked for The Simpson Co. of Berlin (now Kitchener), Ont., first as a salesman and then as the manager of its factory in Berlin. When this company merged with the Canada Furniture Syndicate, Gruetzner established his own factory in Hespeler in 1901.

This spot offers a lofty, industrial backdrop to your photos and a variety of backdrop areas.

Location and directions

Distance from venue: 4 minutes

Address: 25 Milling Rd. Cambridge, ON.

Directions: From Storehouse 408 parking lot, turn Right on Queen St. W. At main intersection, turn Left on Guelph Ave. Turn Left of Milling Rd. until the end. Parking available beside red brick buildings.















JACOB'S LANDING PARK

Highlights

This 2.7 hectares park features picnic tables, open areas, benches, access to the river and has a lovely garden and pergola.

Located on both sides of Guelph Ave, one side offers a lovely garden and pergola on the river, and directly across the street is the waterfall, greenspace and riverfront backdrops.

Location and directions

Distance from venue: 3 minutes

Address: 45 Guelph Ave. Cambridge, ON.

Directions: From Storehouse 408 parking lot, turn Right on Queen St. W. At main intersection, turn Left on Guelph Ave. Turn Left on Milling Rd. and park along the street. Gazebo can be found to your left, and the waterfall is located just across Guelph Ave. on your right.





















DOWNTOWN HESPELER

Highlights

Hespeler is a historic town located on the Speed River in southwestern Ontario.

The town of Hespeler was originally called Bergeytown and then New Hope. In 1845 Jacob Hespeler arrived and purchased 145 acres of land on the Speed River. Subsequently, the settlement of New Hope was incorporated as the village of Hespeler in 1859. As the village grew it was incorporated as a town in 1901.

The quaint downtown location offers a small-town streetscape backdrop to your wedding photos.

Location and directions

Distance from venue: 3 minutes

Address: Queen Street, Cambridge, ON

Directions: From Storehouse 408 parking lot, turn Right on Queen St. W. and you will be downtown in 2 minutes.



TOWN HALL, LIBRARY & SURROUNDING

Highlights

The Hespeler Town Hall is a prominent feature on Tannery Street East. Along with the adjacent library and other surrounding buildings they form an impressive streetscape.

The Old Town Hall boasts a brown brick facade with two-storey columns and was designated heritage in 2001.

The adjacent Hespeler library was originally built in 1901. In 2007, the library was encased in a modern glass structure which offers a modern backdrop to your photos. Due to its' unique design, in 2004 the Canadian Architect Magazine selected the Hespeler Library design as one of the top ten architectural projects across Canada.

Directly across the street is Forbes Park, a vast greenscape perfect for photography.

Location and directions

Distance from venue: 3 minutes

Address: 11 Tannery St. E, Cambridge, ON

Directions: From Storehouse 408 parking lot, turn Right on Queen St. W., Right on Adam St., Left on Tannery St.













ELLACOTT LOOKOUT

Highlights

In this natural area in Cambridge you can find the Ellacott lookout which provides you a view of the two rivers. This lookout is part of the natural heritage tour of the City of Cambridge.

Views of the Hespeler Millpond on the Speed River are some of the more scenic in the region, and is a favourite spot for local photographers.

Location and directions

Distance from venue: 5 minutes

Address: 235 Queen St. E, Cambridge, ON

Directions: From Storehouse 408 parking lot, turn Right on Queen St. W., through downtown and it will be on your left.





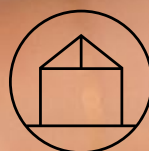
