

## **DOER Releases Draft Stretch Energy Code Regulations**

Dear Stretch Code Stakeholders,

The Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources (DOER) is pleased to release draft code language for its Stretch Energy Code and Specialized Municipal Opt-in Code:

DOER's Draft Regulations have been filed with the Secretary of State on June 24.
