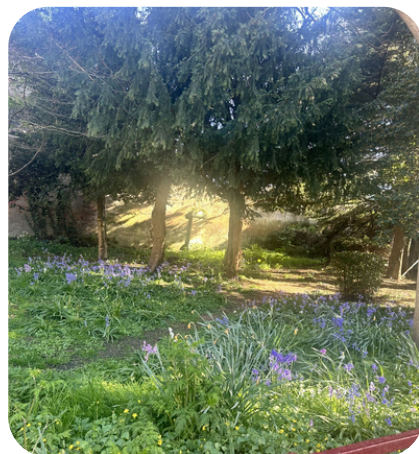

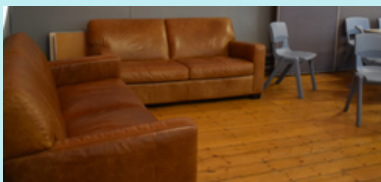

The Sanctuary is divided into small work areas for Sixth Form lessons and independent study.



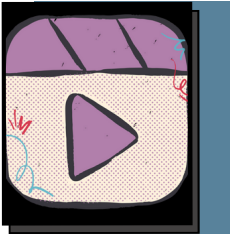
We also have a quiet social space for Sixth Form students for personal study and social time.

Subjects



Maths

A level Mathematics provides a strong foundation for further academic and vocational study and for employment, to give students the appropriate mathematical skills, knowledge and understanding to help them progress to a full range of courses in higher education. This includes undergraduate mathematics courses in other disciplines such as biology, geography, and psychology, where the understanding and application of mathematics is crucial.



Digital Media

This Media RSL course is a Level 3 Extended Certificate in Creative Digital Media (equivalent to one A-Level) is designed to prepare learners for employment and further learning the media sector and arm them with the knowledge and skills to successfully navigate this exciting and ever-evolving industry.



Business

The aim of A level Business (Edexcel) is to introduce students to the challenges and issues of starting a business and the role of the entrepreneur, including raising finance and developing a successful marketing plan. It focuses on how established businesses might improve their effectiveness by making tactical decisions at a functional level such as managing people.



Early Childhood Development

AAQ BTEC National - This Level 3 qualification, equivalent to one A Level, is designed for students interested in working with young children or pursuing further studies in education, psychology, or health. The course combines academic study with hands-on experience, helping learners develop critical thinking, communication, and interpersonal skills.

Animal Care

Animal Care is a level 2 qualification for learners who want to acquire sector-specific applied knowledge and practical skills. The course is through vocational contexts by studying animal health and welfare. This includes signs of good and ill health, causes, transmission and treatment of common diseases in animals, the different health and monitoring checks, factors that affect animal behaviour, and how this impacts of handling and restraint; and what needs to be carried out to prepare, check and clean out animal accommodation.

Photography

The Art and Design Fine Art and Photography A Level course is designed to introduce students to a variety of experiences that employ a range of traditional and new media, processes, and techniques appropriate to the chosen areas of study. We encourage students to participate actively in their course of study, recognising and developing their own strengths in the subject and identifying and sustaining their own lines of enquiry.



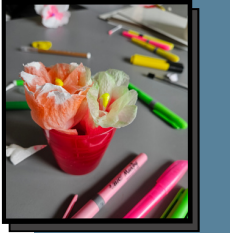
Health and
Social Care

Health and Social Care gives learners the opportunity to develop sector-specific knowledge and skills in a practical learning environment.

Learners who generally achieve at Level 3 across their Key Stage 5 learning might consider progression to:

- Further education in nursing, social work, psychology or education.*
- Careers as a health care worker, nursery worker or support staff.*

Preparing for Adulthood

The 'Preparing for Adulthood' course integrates LIFE, PSHE, and Wellbeing lessons to equip students with the skills, knowledge, and confidence needed for independent, healthy, and fulfilling adult lives.

Together, these lessons form a holistic curriculum that supports students—especially those with SEND or additional needs—in becoming capable, confident adults.

Pastoral

At Connie Rothman School, we are committed to supporting the wellbeing and mental health of our students. All staff play an active role in promoting a positive and nurturing environment, working collaboratively to help each student thrive emotionally, socially, and academically.

For those who require more focused support, we offer weekly therapeutic sessions tailored to individual needs. Alternatively, students can access regular check-in sessions to ensure they feel heard, supported, and valued. These sessions will be reviewed every 6-8 weeks.

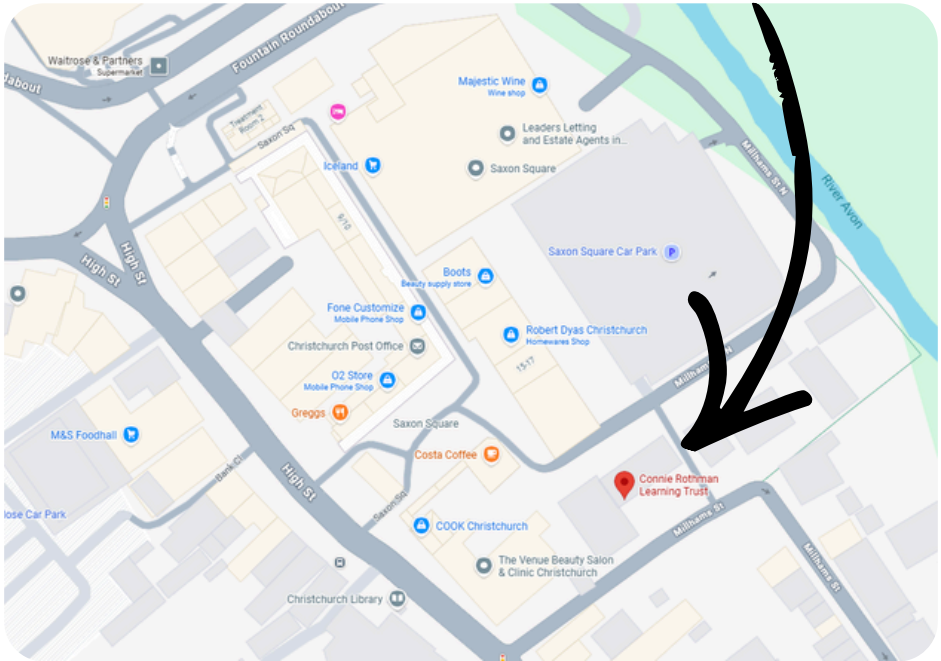
