

The Institute was established in 1979 with the mandate to assist in the development of a coordinated system of programs and services that would enhance the quality of life and promote the growth and well-being of youth and their families in the Town of Huntington.

The Institute is an integral part of the Town of Huntington Youth Bureau's system of comprehensive services, focused on the commitment of helping youth and families develop to their highest potential by practicing youth development which empowers youth to engage in all aspects of programming design to ensure that programs meet their current and emerging needs. As the separate not-for-profit arm of the Town of Huntington Youth Bureau, the Institute is comprised of five specialized Town-wide Projects, serving all 8 public school districts, as well as private and parochial schools. 





Sharon Richmond

Sharon Richmond, a Northport resident, has been a fifth-grade teacher for the North Shore School District for over 24 years. In addition to being an educator, she has co-advised community service and anti-bullying clubs, mentored teachers, and worked with at-risk students. Sharon's volunteer work crosses over several areas. Over the years, she has volunteered abroad in several impoverished countries, building homes with Habitat for Humanity, and currently volunteers her time locally with various agencies in need.

After losing her only child, her son Vincent, she has become a determined advocate for those who struggle with addiction, mental health, and co-occurring disorders. She started as an advocate, going up to Albany to stop the stigma and speak with senators, legislators, and assembly members on the importance of mental health parity and addiction equity. Sharon received the Suffolk County Woman of Distinction in 2023 for her volunteer efforts and is part of the NYS Legal Action Center's Parity Coalition team, achieving the annual advocate honor story.

SCARECROW CONTEST

GUIDELINES FOR DECORATING SCARECROW

Adults and children of any age are eligible to enter the contest. Your scarecrow MUST BE WEATHER-RESISTANT and constructed to withstand the weather and natural elements. NO HAYBALES or PERISHABLE GOODS may be placed on the ground or used in the construction of your scarecrow, this includes pumpkins, squash, etc. In the event of forecasted inclement weather please bring your scarecrow assembled on decorating day.

Scarecrows must be elevated No part of the scarecrow should directly touch the ground The Town of Huntington is NOT RESPONSIBLE for scarecrows on display and reserves the right to remove any scarecrow deemed inappropriate or offensive. You will be notified of your number by email after registration for decorating.

Stakes will be provided at the location and measure either 3 ft or 4ft. The best way to plan the construction and add height is to secure the scarecrow to a PVC pipe and place pipe over fence post OR you can secure your scarecrow with zip ties to the post provided

Please make sure to print out the name of your scarecrow, laminate and affix to your scarecrow so that it can easily be found on the ballot. Also, make sure the number that is on the stake can be seen on your scarecrow. Your scarecrow is listed on the ballot by category, number and name. The public will be the official judge. The scarecrow with the most votes, in each category, wins.

Viewing will begin on Monday, October 6th until Thursday, October 30^{th} . Please stop by to see the scarecrows to cast your vote. All scarecrows will be named and numbered, and the public can vote via QR code. The winners will be announced online on the Huntington Youth Bureau Facebook page on Halloween. So make sure you follow us!





HUNTINGTON SANCTUARY PROJECT

Sanctuary is a specialized project that assists youth between the ages of 12 and 21 who have runaway, are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Sanctuary's professional staff members provide individual, family and group counseling, crisis intervention, and referrals to short-term emergency housing and/or long term independent living programs. All of our services are confidential and free of cost for all Town of Huntington residents.

Sanctuary's Host Home Program consists of families or individual adults who volunteer to provide temporary shelter to a youth between the ages of 12-17 who are experiencing a crisis with their family of origin. Potential Host Homes are screened and NYS certified. A typical stay is 1 week with a maximum stay for 30 days. Youth are thoroughly screened by Sanctuary Counselors.

Host homes are volunteer families that provide short term, emergency housing to runaway and homeless youth ages 12-17 experiencing a crisis.

A typical stay is between 1 day with a maximum stay of 30 days.

This provides the youth a "cooling off" period while the family engages in mediation and counseling.

Youth are carefully screened prior to placement.
