


ETHOPIAN WEDDING TRADITIONS

2 Days Prior	Telosh Ceremony	Bride's Home	4:00pm - 7:00pm	Groom's family presents gifts to the bride, followed by guests presenting their gifts.
Wedding Day	Groom's Arrival	Bride's Home	7:30am - 9:00am	Groom arrives; playful exchange at the door; bride accepts flowers; everyone departs together.
	Photography Hour	Picturesque Garden	9:30am - 10:30am	Bridal party and guests take photos; vehicles decorated with flowers leading a road procession.
	Knee Kissing Ceremony	Wedding Hall Entrance	11:00am - 11:30am	Couple bows to elders, receives blessing to enter the hall.
	Wedding Lunch/Engagement Cake Cutting	Wedding Hall	12:00pm - 3:30pm	Couple makes a grand entrance, greets guests, & lunch is served after a prayer. Rings are exchanged, cake is cut, serve champagne, and bride throws candy-filled packages.
	Name Readings & Dancing	Wedding Hall	3:30pm - 5:00pm	Couple has first dance; guests join in; band announces messages from absent friends and family.
	Dinner at Groom's Parents' Home	Groom's Family Home	6:30pm - 9:00pm	Dinner party hosted by groom's parents; evening spent reminiscing and celebrating.
3 Days After	Kelekel Ceremony	Agreed Vemue	3:00pm - 6:00pm	Extended family gathers, parents bless the couple, and farewells mark the end of the celebration.










MARRIAGE CLOTHING
