As a club that provides services and classes to young persons and/or adults at risk, we take our safeguarding procedures *very* seriously. Whilst this document is NOT our safeguarding policy, it does aim to introduce you to our safeguarding protocols and acts as our safeguarding statement.

## 1. OUR SAFEGUARDING PROCEDURES

As a club, Torikai Martial Arts takes its safeguarding procedures very seriously. Whilst this document aims to briefly bring you up to speed on our safeguarding procedures, it is not a substitute for our safeguarding policy and other related articles, which are available freely upon request.

We have a full safeguarding policy in place and all instructors are DBS Checked to an enhanced level, with Aimee Little (BMABA) being appointed as our safeguarding lead.

All Instructors hold a relevant safeguarding qualification that helps them identify the need for proper safeguarding protocols and deal with any concerns efficiently and effectively.

We would ask that any persons interested in finding out more take the time to read through our safeguarding policy and associated guidelines in full, and raise any questions you may have with our person responsible for safeguarding in point 3.
