Door prizes - Karen won the volcanic bomb and Evva won the chert coral.


50/50 - Malcolm won \$50, Mike won the Brazilian Agate, and Carol won the Granite Pegmatite.

Date: Saturday, February 21, 2026.

Location of the Field Trip Site: The site is a 5-mile drive north of Payson on FR 1163.

Where and When We Will Meet: We will meet at the Show Low Chamber of Commerce at 8:00 AM and depart around 8:15. The group will also meet at the Jack in the Box parking lot in Payson. This is in the Safeway shopping center. The Show Low group should arrive in Payson between 9:45 and 10:00. Club members may travel directly to the Payson meeting site.

Recommended Vehicle: Any vehicle can reach the collecting site. However, the last half mile gets a bit rocky, although it is level.

What we will collect: We will collect Shoo Fly agate.


SUGALITE

Sugilite was introduced to the lapidary market in the late 1970s. It is composed of sodium lithium iron manganese aluminum silicate. It is massive and tough, translucent to opaque, and has a hardness of 6.5. Sugilite is prized for its striking purple to red-violet color, and it is ideal for cabochon cutting. Sugilite was first discovered in 1944 on Iwaga Islet, Japan, but the most significant deposits are in the Northern Cape Province of South Africa. Synthesized sugilite has recently been introduced to the market.


