NOVEMBER FIELD TRIP REPORT

FOREST LAKES FOSSILS & SHARP CREEK ZEBRA CHERT

At the start of the week before our November field trip, the weather was not looking good. Multiple rainstorms were expected by the weekend. Since our September adventure was canceled due to heavy rain, we decided to wait for the Friday forecast to decide. Fortunately, it appeared we would have at least half a day without rain, so we decided to proceed with at least a short day of rockhounding.

Despite some initial confusion about where and when we would gather, with the help of modern technology we got all seven participants linked up and in the field. Our first stop was a bit disappointing. Apparently, the easy access to this well-known fossil site had resulted in it being picked clean of the previously abundant brachiopods. However, a second site, about a quarter mile from the parking area, had not suffered from over-collecting. After this initial success, Donna suggested trying a third site farther north, where the club had previously collected. She expected more variety of fossils there. This turned out to be the case; in addition to the brachiopods, we found fossils of sponges and corals in abundance.

The rain was holding off, and the temperature was comfortable when we made the move to the Sharp Creek site. The road into this site has been very rough in the past, and it was even worse this time. Fortunately, all club members had 4WD, high-clearance vehicles. By driving slowly and carefully, everyone made it over the very rocky, steep, and muddy access road. This location has multiple sites where zebra chert is found, so we selected one that had the least challenging access. It turned out to be a good choice. As is frequently the case, our members began finding collectable material within a step or two from their vehicles. Larger chunks of zebra chert were found in abundance within a hundred yards of the parking area. So, the group spread out through the beautiful forest and found so much chert requiring multiple trips back and forth to their vehicles to avoid overloading their buckets.

After a couple of hours, the rockhounds began wandering back to the parking area, happy with what they had found. After a bit, we noticed that one of our members was missing. We figured out which direction he had gone and decided to start looking for him. Honking our horns didn't help, but some hunters and other off-roaders were driving in the area. We asked them to help find our lost companion. Terry and Dick drove down the only road that headed in the right direction. Eventually, Donna and Terry returned with our lost person. One of the off-road groups had found him quite a distance from the parking area. He had gotten turned around and was headed away from the parking area. His wife was greatly relieved to have her spouse back, as was the entire group.

With that problem solved, and the threat of rain increasing, we made the challenging climb back up the steep and rocky road to the Beeline Highway. In spite of a couple of challenges, it turned out to be another successful field trip.



ROCK OF THE MONTH

LABRADORITE

Labradorite is a member of the feldspar mineral family, first discovered in Labrador, Canada, in the late 18th century. It occurs in Canada, Finland, Madagascar, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina and Texas.



The basic color of labradorite is light semi-transparent gray, yellowish, green or occasionally reddish. Internal striations reflect and refract light to produce iridescent flashes of color that change with light angle and viewing angle (labradorescence). Labradorite is composed of sodium calcium aluminum silicate and has a hardness of 6 to 6.5 on the Mohs scale.

Labradorite is used for cabochons, beads and highly polished objects, such as paperweights.

In Inuit legend labradorite is said to have been created when a warrior freed the northern lights trapped in rocks.
