I work with the GGFAN Children's Department and as the superintendent of the seventeen Samburu County Nkalup Vision (SCNV) preschools. I attended the Maclin training at Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore Kentucky from 25th June to 11th July

2023 and was hosted by a family from Kenya.

The training transformed and impacted my view of cross-cultural ministry. The TMS Global trainers were very informative and provided the best training module. It was inspiring to meet with other missionaries serving God in hostile and challenging regions of the world. We had time to share about our ministries, encourage one another, and pray together.

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CHURCH EMPOWERMENT

GGFAN CONFERENCE 2023

Every year, GGFAN organizes an annual conference to foster unity and harmony among all the tribes we are reaching. There are eleven regions in total represented at this conference, which lasts at least two days and brings together our congregants from

Nyahururu, Kipipiri, Shamata, Isiolo, Marsabit, Nakuru, Bahati, Lchamus, Samburu, Olkalou, and Subukia. By doing this, our church members have the opportunity to interact and socialize with members of different cultures, thereby creating cross-cultural relations and promoting harmony among the tribes. Additionally, attendees are taught the word of God and fellowship together. The GGFAN Annual Conference 2023 was held in August at Salient High School in our Olkalou Region. This was the first conference following the COVID-19 pandemic that affected public gatherings and conferences. The conference's theme was equipping the saints for the works of service (Ephesians 4:11-13). More than 650 congregants from about ninety churches in our eleven regions attended the conference that started on 16th August to 19th August.

MERCY MINISTRY CHILDREN ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Our Home of the Good Shepherd (HOTGS) family continues to grow in age, faith, and intellect. The home strives to ensure that all our children have access to food, clothes, shelter, and education. This is in line with our vision of rescuing these children and

helping them to achieve their dreams and realize their potential. For sixteen years, over a hundred children have been nurtured and reintegrated into society. Currently, the home has 112 children under its care who continue to be nurtured.

Out of the 42 students that we have in primary school, eleven students exceeded our expectations as per the grading in the Kenyan Competency-Based Curriculum. Twenty-one children are average-performing students who have met expectations. The ten remaining students exhibited below-average performance: our social worker is dedicated to ensuring that these children are given the necessary help to help better their performance.

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AGRICULTURE

Sustainable agriculture is the epitome of every society in Kenya. Most households depend on mainly small-scale farming for their income and livelihood. This makes agriculture one of the strong pillars of the Kenyan economy. The main goal aim of the GGFAN Agricultural Department is to help the farmers achieve maximum output with minimal input by training them on best agricultural practices and the use of technology.

In August 2023, the department carried out activities such as regional experts' project monitoring and the harvesting of corn at the Home of the Good Shepherd farm. The team

also visited the Wambugu farm to invite unreached stakeholders to the Agricultural Expo in February 2024. The team handed out invitation cards to potential stakeholders who are expected to attend the expo planning meetings.

It would also make it easier and encourage more engagement in carrying out their different chores at home. If they were clothed with love, obedience to their guardians would be easier.
