MISSIONS TO THE UNREACHED

Mission to the Samburu Teenage Mothers

Missionary work in Kenya is not all about bringing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the unreached and least-reached but also fighting to eradicate primitive cultural practices. Most of these cultural practices

discriminate against gender and encourage domestic violence. A team of pastors under the Samburu County Nkalup Vision (SCNV) visited the Full Gospel Church in Barsaloi Village to evangelize, disciple, and strengthen the church. In their door-to-door evangelism, the team helped win the souls of many among them were two teenage girls who are victims of these primitive cultural practices.

No Smoke, No School!

Food security is a major issue in Samburu County. Most families spend an entire day hungry; often surviving on a single meal a day. This means that most children often

sleep on a hungry stomach since their caregivers have nothing to feed them. These caregivers often take advantage of school feeding programs to keep their children fed. The children are sent to school on school days not necessarily to acquire education but to get at least a meal. In schools with feeding programs such as the Samburu County Nkalup Vision (SCNV), the enrollment is often high as
