Looking back at the life of Wilson, he did everything with urgency. He embraced GGFAN's vision and was passionate about reaching the unreached tribes. In a span of only ten years, he had planted sixteen



GGFAN churches in Baringo. He started three nursery schools which have helped to provide easy access to education for children within his area. He also trained and mentored many pastors both within GGFAN and outside.

In 2015, he organized a huge peace and reconciliation meeting which brought

together delegates from seven tribes. People who were sworn enemies for many generations worshipped and praised Jesus together. In 2022, Wilson hosted yet another huge meeting attended by the then-deputy president who is now the Kenyan president; H.E Dr. Wilson Samoei Ruto. This gathering was attended by eleven of the northern tribes. In March 2023, he was part of the pastors who organized a week-long prayer and fasting attended by the First Lady, Her Excellency Mrs. Rachel Ruto, to pray for the peaceful coexistence of the tribes in northern Kenya. The prayers were held in Marigat, the main town of the Lchamus tribe.

been conducting training where he encourages people to join God in his mission of blessing the tribes in Kenya through our Lord Jesus Christ (Genesis 12). His main mission has been to sensitize the body of Christ to join God's mission of reaching five of Kenya's 22 unreached tribes.

In June, Bishop Simon hosted six pastors of the Full Gospel Churches of Kenya (FGCK) from Murang'a County. The pastors were led by Bishop Bernard Mugambi. The main agenda of the visit was to share more about how the FGCK Murang'a would join the Samburu County Nkalup Vision (SCNV) work in Samburu North. The bishop and the pastors undertook a mission visit to Samburu under the guidance of missionary Julius Njuguna.

good progress of crop growth, the department harvested some of the ready crops. The crops included tomatoes, capsicum, and peas.

The regional experts have started forming cooperative groups in their respective regions. This comes after the agreement made by the departmental leaders and the regional experts on the advantages of establishing cooperatives. Some of the advantages include better control of product prices on a group basis, identification of better markets for bulk produce, improved access to seeds and inputs as well as easy access to Information, knowledge, and extension services.
