MISSIONS TO THE UNREACHED

Reaching The Samburu Children With Education

The [Samburu County Nkalup Early Childhood Development Education \(NECED\) program](#) began in September 2018 with the goal of opening and operating pre-schools serving children ages 4-12 in each of the six divisions of Samburu county. Most of these schools meet in buildings donated by the community, [SCNV](#), or a church. Some of the Nkalup churches are used as classrooms to help reach villages with the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ and also bring pre-school education closer to the Samburu children.

Bill Johnson of Faith Ventures Inc. in partnership with Samburu inter-denominational church leaders under SCNV have been supporting [17 pre-school nurseries](#) by monthly stipending ECDE teachers from hard ,last and least reached areas of Samburu. These 17 pre schools are serving more than 850 Samburu children who are the next generation of the Samburu tribe. They have also been providing relief food to some of the schools to help feed the children and keep them in school. One of the schools that has been receiving relief food is the [Lulu pre-school](#). This has motivated many pupils to continue coming to school to learn. [Read more](#).

The intention is to establish these schools on a firm Christian foundation and provide quality education to these children as they grow, so as to break the eminent cycles affecting the Samburu tribe. The Nkalup pre-school program also seeks to tackle the five most severe challenges of limited food availability, water shortage, in-accessibility of pre-school education, tribal insecurity, and harsh climatic conditions in Samburu. Nkalup Relief Feeding In Samburu

In 2022 through the donations from St. Michaels Anglican Church, Faith Ventures Inc, MeMe of the McNairy Foundation and the Harvey-McNairy Foundation, Nkalup was able to provide the round 7, [round 8](#) and [round 9](#) of famine relief food in Samburu County which was greatly affected by drought. The food distribution process was facilitated by Samburu County Nkalup vision coordinators spread over the six divisions of Samburu.

The Nkalup relief feeding program started in June 2020 and by December 2022, they had distributed more than 534,025 meals to vulnerable and medically fragile people who were suffering from the locust invasion and three years of drought and food insecurity in Kenya. The relief food also helped feed the NKALUP pre-school children and motivate the Samburu children to attend school.

We are grateful to God for these donations which greatly helped relieve the pangs of hunger in Samburu county. We also thank God that many people are coming to know the Good News of God's love through Jesus because of the consistency of the love Nkalup have shown for God's people in Samburu.

Church Construction In The Unreached Regions

In its quest to make Samburu county a county reached with the gospel Nkalup Vision has been planting churches in this region. The goal is to plant 1000 churches in Samburu having 50,000 followers of Christ. By December 2022, Nkalup had already started 839 churches and fellowships in Samburu which is 83.9% of the Nkalup goal accomplished. 101 of these churches have already been built while the others are still preaching points.

Some of the churches planted this year by Nkalup include Full Gospel Churches of Kenya, the Samburu Leiroya Church, Lorubae Church, GGFAN Lorukushu Church in Marsabit and [4 GGFAN churches in Lchamus](#). These GGFAN churches were [officially opened](#) by Bishop Simon in July 2022 and the villagers have been meeting there for fellowship. Most of these built churches are used as nursery schools for young children during weekdays. [Watch video](#).

The efforts of the GGFAN Church reaching the unreached through church buildings among the Samburu, Rendille, Turkana and Ilchamus tribes has been greatly empowered by the generosity of our partners. We are grateful to the St. Michaels Anglican Church of Charleston, South Carolina (U.S.), Bill Johnson of Faith Ventures Inc. and his friends together with all our friends and partners who have continued to support us in spreading the gospel to the unreached regions and making Christ known.

We thank God for the growth of our ministry as some GGFAN pastors have also been constructing permanent church structures in their region to help accommodate more people in the house of God. One of the churches under construction is the GGFAN church in Baringo under Pastor Dixon Leleboo, GGFAN Captain Church under Pastor Nderitu and GGFAN Manguo Church under Pastor John Kinyua. Many other GGFAN churches are in the process of

obtaining a piece of land to build a church to accommodate the rising number of new believers.

Mercy Ministry

Relief Food Distribution In The Unreached Regions

As a way of demonstrating God's love to the needy and the less fortunate people among the unreached and the least reached communities, GGFAN through the Mercy Ministry department has been distributing relief food to these communities where most of the people were affected by prolonged drought. The distribution process started in January 2022 in Marsabit, Laisamis region where the people from this region had stayed for three years without rainfall and drought had taken a huge toll on them and their livestock.

The [first relief food distribution](#) process was in January where we distributed 25 sacks of maize, 90kgs each and 12 sacks of beans, 90 kgs each ([Watch Video](#)) and the [second distribution](#) was in April where we distributed forty bags of maize and fifteen bags of beans ([watch video](#)). The [third round](#) of distribution was in September when we distributed 100 bags of maize, 24 bags of beans, 40 bags of rice and 500 cabbages in Isiolo and Marsabit. [Watch video](#).

We thank God that we were not only able to give relief food but also made a difference in the lives of these people. Most of them were starving and had been sleeping with empty stomachs. Yet God used us to touch and bless them with physical and spiritual food. To them, the GGFAN relief food was like the manna which God provided to the Israelites while they were in the wilderness.

The villagers were excited that God had finally remembered them.

We are grateful to the [Centenary United Methodist Church](#) and the [Weddington Methodist Church](#) and all our friends who partnered with us to feed these communities. Home Of The Good Shepherd (HOTGS)

Admission of New Children at HOTGS

The Home of the Good Shepherd has continued to transform the lives of many needy and vulnerable children in the community. In 2022, we [enrolled a new cohort of 39 orphaned, and vulnerable children\(OVCs\)](#) at HOTGS for care and protection.

The need for taking in new children arose after seeing many children suffering due to their vulnerability while others are turning to social evils due to lack of proper guidance and education especially from our surrounding community. Also after 15 years of existence, 45 of our children have outgrown the home and are now self reliant.

The process began by conducting [home assessment and evaluating](#) the living

conditions of the children who had applied for help in order to know how we can help them. Assessments were conducted in Baringo, Nakuru and Laikipia Counties in Kenya with thirty three homes visited and forty three OVCs were interviewed. In May 2022, we enrolled 25 orphaned and vulnerable children at HOTGS. By December 2022, we had added to this number and currently we have enrolled 39 children, all of whom have already been admitted to school.

One of the children enrolled at HOTGS was [James Muchai](#) who was very supportive to [Samuel Gikonyo](#) who is one of the HOTGS special children. Despite James being orphaned and having nobody to support him through school, he still had the strength to help Samuel with joy. His act of kindness caught the hearts of many and HOTGS decided to [support him through school](#). We thank all our friends and partners who answered our call and came through to help James clear his primary school fees balance and also join high school. Through your help, James is now progressing on well and is still in school studying. This year he will be joining grade 10.

HOTGS 2022 Guests

In 2022, we also received a number of guests who came to visit and spend time with our children at the Home of the Good Shepherd. We received some students from the Rift Valley Institute of Science and Technology. It was a group of fifty students together with their lecturers who were mobilized by one of the HOTGS alumni, John Mwangi who was also a student at RVIST. They spent their day at the Home of the Good Shepherd helping with the chores at the home. The purpose of the visit was to help with the daily chores of the home as they interact with the children and offer encouragement and spiritual guidance especially to the new cohort of children that were rescued at HOTGS.

In July 2022, we were also blessed to host Julie Broderson and Hannah Brewer both from Centenary United Methodist Church, USA. The two were on a two-day visit to GGFAN and HOTGS offices. During their visit, Julie Broderson got the chance to meet and talk to the staff members from the GGFAN head office. She also hosted a couple's seminar for the GGFAN Pastors and their wives from the Nyahururu Region at the Nyahururu town church. Hannah Brewer, a social worker by profession, spent time with the HOTGS children and the social workers as she learned more about social work practices in Kenya. After a brief introduction and interaction with the GGFAN and HOTGS staff, Hannah and the HOTGS social workers spent the afternoon on the first day visiting a vulnerable family. They also spent time playing games with some of the HOTGS children, Ashley, Jayden and Musa, and later went for a shopping spree with them before

baking a cake for the children. It was such a pleasure and honor to have Hannah and Julie visit us, the children were happy beyond measures and all those they interacted with were blessed. [Watch video.](#)

2022 Graduations

We also celebrated the graduation ceremony for 6 of our children who were in college. They include [Hamisa Wambui](#) who graduated with a Bachelors degree in Information Technology in 2021 and also graduated with a diploma in cosmetology in December 2022 together with her long lost brother Ramathan. The others who graduated this year were Ruth Wamucii who graduated with a diploma in Health Record and Information, Daniel Waweru who graduated with a diploma in Computer Science, Jane Wanjiku and Millicent who graduated with a diploma in hairdressing. We thank God for this milestone in the lives of these children as they embark on a journey of being self reliant which is our vision at HOTGS.

In September 2022, four of the HOTGS children who did their grade 12 exam in March 2022 were able to join college to continue with their education. These children include Francis Muriithi, Joseph Njhia, Peter Ndirangu and Johnson Gachomo. Francis was enrolled at Technical University of Mombasa where he is pursuing a Bachelors of Science degree in Mathematics and Computer Science. Joseph joined Butere Technical and Vocational college where he is pursuing a Diploma in Electrical Engineering while Joseph Ndirangu and Johnson Gachomo joined Kiambu Institute to Science and Technology to pursue a certificate in plumbing.

International Day of the African Child Celebrations 2022

In 2022 seven of our little children from the HOTGS participated in the [International day of the African Child](#) celebrations in Nyahururu. In parts of Laikipia and Nyandarua counties, Charitable Children Institutions (CCI), came together to mark this day. The activity was carried out at the Heroes of The Nation children's home in Nyahururu and it brought together about fifteen CCIs, including Home of The Good Shepherd, and was attended by about 400 school children, the Director of Children's Office, chiefs, social workers, volunteers, teachers and students. Academic Progress

Currently the Home of the Good Shepherd has 102 children. Of these children, 45 are in primary school, 33 are in secondary school while 24 are in college/universities. We appreciate your continued support in caring for these children and educating them.

Five of our children did their primary school national examination in November 2022 and are looking forward to joining a secondary school in 2023. They include; Stephen Kabocha who did his grade six national exam (KPSEA) under the new education system in Kenya, Zachary Mwangi, Paul Lowoto, Joseph Lukwawi and Moses Gikonyo who did their grade 8 national exam (KCPE). Seven of our children also did their grade 12 national examination in December 2022 are now awaiting their results. Good test scores will provide students with the best educational opportunities for their futures. They include; Mark Kariuki, Rebecca Amana, Maryselah Njeri, Vivian Chebet, Veronicah Wanjiru, Jane Wambui and Peter Maina.

HOTGS Farm and 2023 food Support

Last year we experienced droughts which greatly affected our crops in the HOTGS farm. We experienced [crop failure twice](#) due to lack of enough rainfall. Over the years, we have been planting maize and wheat which are consumed by our children from HOTGS and Little Lambs Academy in our 5 acre farm. Due to the effects of drought we were afraid that we could experience food shortage at HOTGS and LLA in 2023 but we are grateful to God for our friends from Centenary Church through the Little Lambs closet sale who donated funds to help us purchase maize and beans which will be consumed by the pupils for the entire 2023 academic year. We give God the glory!

At the Home of the Good Shepherd, we are grateful to God for how far he has brought us. We thank Him for the children's lives that we have been able to touch and transform like that of [Josephine Naanyu](#) who was [rescued from early marriage](#), [Veronica and his brother John](#) who were living in deplorable conditions, [John Njau](#), [Anita](#), [Vivian](#) and many more. It is our joy seeing what

the Lord is doing through our ministry and we glorify his name.

CHURCH EMPOWERMENT

New GGFAN Region

On Saturday 22nd January, GGFAN established a new region known as Subukia region. This new region was split from the larger Nyahururu region which had grown widely under Rev. John Kinyua. The establishment of this new Subukia region shows how the body of Christ is growing in Kenya. Reverend Stephen Muchoki was ordained by Bishop Simon as the new regional overseer of Subukia Region. This now brings a total of 11 GGFAN regions. [Watch Video.](#)

In April 2022, Bishop Simon also [ordained Missionary Henry Wachira](#) as the regional overseer of Marsabit region. Missionary Henry Wachira has been one of the GGFAN missionaries working among the unreached tribes of Rendile and Borana in Laisamis, Marsabit region. In 2018, GGFAN established a church in Lorukushu village which is one of the villages in the outskirts of Laisamis town; which is one of the smallest towns in Marsabit County. Missionary Henry Wachira has been pastoring this church which has continued to grow and reach more people in Laisamis which is one of the unreached regions in Kenya. [Watch video.](#)

As a way of empowering women from the unreached tribes to be in leadership, Bishop Simon also recently ordained Mrs. Monicah Nduta as a pastor at GGFAN Loikas Church. GGFAN Pastors Scholarship Fund

The GGFAN scholarship program started in 2018 to provide financial aid to GGFAN pastors and staff by paying their children's school fees. The aim of this program has been to motivate GGFAN pastors in being committed to attain the GGFAN vision and mission in order to improve the ministry's productivity. The fund is also given as a way of supporting our pastors so that they may be able to keep on with the good work of reaching out to the unreached without any hurdles in life. Since 2018 over 70 pastors and GGFAN staff members have benefitted from this program with over 300 children getting sponsored through primary school and secondary school.

This program has been of great encouragement to our pastors. It has also inspired them to be more focused and engaged in their pastoral work of caring for the church and the congregation. As a result, we have experienced remarkable growth in our ministry in terms of church membership and the opening of new churches. In 2018, GGFAN had a total of 56 churches with

3500 members which increased to 78 churches with approximately 5500 members by July 2022.

We owe this growth to God and our partners who generously support our ministry. The commitment shown by our pastors ever since they started receiving the scholarship fund has been substantial to our growth.

GGFAN Agriculture Extension

Training Agricultural Expert

The GGFAN agriculture team has been doing a great job in empowering needy and vulnerable families in the unreached and least reached regions by training them on best agricultural practices that will help them move to a level of self-sustainability. The main aim of this project is to help reduce poverty by making a measurable improvement in the agricultural outputs of the regions here in Kenya.

The GGFAN Agricultural Extension Officer together with the agronomist have been visiting GGFAN's eleven regions and training the people on best agricultural practices. In each of these regions, they have identified one person who is really good in agriculture, especially in growing a certain crop or good in rearing livestock animals. They then pick this person to be the regional expert and their purpose is to help facilitate training in their regions even in the absence of the extension officer and agronomist.

To support the regional experts, GGFAN started small agricultural projects for them in their regions. The projects include poultry keeping, Irish potato farming, bulb onion farming, and dairy goat farming. The projects have been running well and the experts are excited about these projects since they have exposed them to more learning and gaining first-hand experience. [Read more.](#)

Agricultural Trip

In 2022, Curtis and Paula Burnet from Weddington Methodist Church made an agricultural mission trip to Kenya accompanied by Walter Okullu and Nicholas Ssebalamu from the [Field of Hope in Uganda](#). The trip was aimed at sharing knowledge on how GGFAN can use agriculture to improve the lives of the least reached tribes in Kenya such as the Samburu, Rendille, Lchamus and the Turkana.

The GGFAN Agricultural Extension officer learned a lot from this visit and looks forward to developing farming groups in GGFAN Churches and empower them

to achieve the best results in agriculture and help create self - sustaining families through agriculture this year. [watch video](#).

Uganda Agricultural Trip

A team of three people from God's Grace for all Nations (GGFAN) Kenya visited Field of Hope in Uganda with the aim of learning how agriculture is taught in schools and also how Field of Hope uses agriculture to empower the community and especially women. The team composed of Kevin Nyabiba, an agricultural officer at GGFAN, James Kamundia, an agronomist at GGFAN and Duncan Kahunyo, a head teacher at the GGFAN Little Lambs Academy. During their visit, they toured various areas of interest including schools and farming groups which were doing very well in the area as a result of agriculture. They were able to witness how agriculture has transformed the lives of school children and women in Uganda. The GGFAN Agricultural team learned a lot on how they can help in empowering the unreached communities in Kenya through agriculture in order to ensure that these communities are able to produce their own food instead of relying on regular food donations. GGFAN Agriculture Field day

The GGFAN Agriculture department will conduct an agriculture Field day in February 2023 to showcase and educate farmers from Laikipia County on best agricultural practises. GGFAN as partnered with various agricultural and seed companies in Kenya who will showcase their products during the show. Plans and preparations for this day are still underway.

EDUCATION

Little Lambs Academy

In March 2022, 39 grade 8 pupils from Little Lambs Academy did their national exam known as Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE). This was the first national examination to be conducted at the school and we thank God that our pupils performed well.

Following the good performance posted by the Little Lambs Academy(LLA) 2021 candidates in their March 2022 national examinations, the school held a [thanksgiving ceremony](#) to give gratitude to God, and to all who contributed to the good performance of the school. We believe that it is by the grace of God and the combined efforts of all the stake holders that the school was able to

perform well. The school had a mean score of 290 marks out of 500. Ranked with other schools in Nyahururu sub county, LLA was positioned ten out of ninety one schools while in the Marmanet zone, LLA was position three out of nineteen schools. [Watch video](#). This being the first national exams to be conducted at the school, the performance was outstanding and promising.

As the schools in Kenya tried to recover for the time lost during lockdown in 2020, the national examinations were conducted twice in 2022. Before the pandemic, national examination were conducted once per year.

In November 2022 Little Lambs Academy had 29 pupils who did the grade 8 national examination. The results were released in December and we thank God that there was an improvement in performance as the school had a mean score of 297 marks. The schools best candidate was [Joseph Lukwawi](#) who scored 385 marks out of the possible 500. Joseph is a child from the Home of the Good Shepherd.

Before sitting for these exams, the school normally conducts prayers days for all the candidates to commit them before the Lord as they prepare to sit for their national primary school exit exam that would usher them into high school.

A new education system was introduced in Kenya and has already started taking effect in the country. The new system is known as the [Competency Based Curriculum, CBC](#), where each learner's progress is monitored over a period of 2-6-6-3 years. Under this system, the learners will spend two years in pre-primary level then proceed to primary school from grade one to six, and then transition to secondary school for six years, a period that will be split into two: junior secondary school (three years) and senior secondary school (three years). The final level is three years of university studies.

We thank God that Little Lambs Academy is one of the private schools which has been approved by the Kenyan government to offer junior secondary education from January 2023. The junior secondary will be starting from grade 7 to grade 9.

GGFAN Bible School Graduation

The GGFAN Bible School classes conducted their 6th graduation in March and April 2022. The 12 students who were in the Nyahururu class graduated on 2nd April while the 18 students from Lchamus class graduated on 31st March 2022. All the students were awarded a diploma in theological studies with those from Nyahururu also receiving a certificate in consistent bible reading.

Before the graduation, the students embarked on a [mission to Samburu](#) which was an important part of their training and allows them to gain real cross-cultural experience and interaction while practicing what they have learned in class and applying the skills of evangelism under the supervision of their lecturers. It also gives the pastor trainees an opportunity to practice holistic ministry.

During the mission the students planted a new church/preaching point in a Manyatta community which had no church completely. When the students went to witness in this community, many people gave their lives to Jesus and so the need for discipleship. The mission was very successful with over one hundred souls coming to Christ.

In 2022, GGFAN Bible School partnered with Pan Africa Christian University to offer diploma and certificate courses to our students. Pan Africa Christian University is a chartered university recognized by the commission for higher education in Kenya. The GGFAN Bible School students will now be receiving diplomas and certificates which will be nationally recognized and can be used for further education.

At GGFAN Bible school we continue to thank God for the [Weddington Methodist Church](#) in Weddington, N.C. (U.S.) who have been supporting the the school over the years; empowering and enabling pastors and church leaders to be equipped with knowledge and skills of doing ministry and spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ. We have witnessed this training help pastors and church leaders from the unreached regions in serving God's people with knowledge and understanding thus impacting in their community. The gospel is being spread to all corners of the world. We continue to thank God for the transformation taking place in the hearts and minds of our students.

Trainings

GGFAN has been partnering with other organizations to conduct trainings for our pastors, leaders and the staffs in order to empower them and equip them even as they serve the body of Christ throughout the world.

ILI Training

The GGFAN Bible school students from Nyahururu and Lchamus went through the [International Leadership Institute training](#) of History Makers journey. This training aimed at mobilizing men and women with the best leadership and discipleship tools and provide an opportunity for a transformational encounter with God. The learners were taught on the eight core values which Christian leaders should have. These values include; intimacy with God, passion for the harvest, visionary leadership, culturally relevant evangelism, family priority, faithful stewardship and integrity. They were taught on how these eight core values affects who they are and everything they do as a Christian leader.

After the training, the learners were awarded with a certificate of participation. According to some who attended this training, they were greatly challenged by this training and their eyes were opened as they learned what God desires from them as leaders and many of them purposed to do things differently and in a better way as they learned in the ILI training. They were also encouraged to share what they have learned with others and also train other leaders on the eight core-values to be able to become effective leaders and beacons of life and hope in their communities.

Orality Trauma Healing Training

In February 2022, GGFAN pastors and church leaders attended an orality trauma healing training where they were trained on how to be good listeners and good story tellers and be able to share Bible stories that will bring hope and healing to the communities. They were trained on how to guide and help people from their village, most of whom are illiterate on how to handle traumatic experiences and receive healing.

The training was attended by twenty delegates who were trained for nine days. The training was more oral to ensure that they are able to grasp and remember every content taught and be able to help others in their villages receive healing. It involved telling and retelling Bible stories and then dramatizing the stories to ensure the learners don't forget. Afterwards they would undertake a healing activity at the end of these lessons and share these Bible stories with other people. The delegates were also led on a healing journey and most of them left the training having received freedom and healing.

Advanced Trauma Healing Training

In June 2022, Lynn and Sharon Fogleman from TMS Global together with Dedan from the Bible Society, conducted the [trauma healing training](#) at GGFAN. They started by conducting the advanced trauma healing equipping session from 27th June to 1st July 2022. Thirty one students went through this

advanced training. All of them had attended the initial equipping session in October 2021 and also co-led or led at least one healing group and submitted their reports. The advanced session is important as it sharpens the skills acquired at the initial session and during the practicum. [Read more](#) and [watch video](#).

GSL Training

In September 2022, GGFAN in partnership with [Global Servant Leaders \(GSL\)](#) successfully trained twenty four GGFAN leaders, pastors and staff in GSL training which aimed at equipping and empowering these GGFAN leaders and pastors to develop a servant leader attitude and lead like Christ did. Those who attended were trained and empowered to become global servant leaders who will carry the light of Christ throughout the world and lead through service to impact the world. They were trained how to cultivate a way of life that will help them grow deeper in their relationship with God and others. After the training the delegates were awarded with certificates of participation.
