I was born in 1974 in Mekaro village, North Kinangop, Nyandarua County, the second

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OCTOBER 2025 UPDATES

Little Lambs Academy (LLA)

"The year wrapped up in late October at Little Lambs Academy, where our 358 students began their 13-week holiday on October 21 after 34 weeks of learning. However, Grade Six and Grade Nine students stayed behind to prepare for the Kenya Primary School Education Assessment (KPSEA) from October 27 to 29 and the Kenya Junior School Education Assessment (KJSEA) from October 27 to November 3. Both teachers and students approached the exams with optimism, trusting God for great results to advance next year to junior school for the grade six students and senior school for the grade nine students."

"I am happy to announce that our primary and secondary school children have closed for the December holiday with



enthusiasm, looking forward to their next classes in 2026. This update excludes grades six, nine, and twelve, who are still in school for national exams. Grade six and nine students completed the KPSEA and KJSEA exams, while grade twelve students are currently taking the Kenya Certificate of

Secondary Examination (KCSE).

Many children have been released to go live with their guardians and foster parents, while those without relatives continue to stay at our home as we seek to help them find good foster homes. We are grateful for a successful academic year and pray for those taking their national examinations."
