From the Archives

Saint Mark's Church of Green Island



Saint Mark's Church of Green Island was closed to consolidate village churches. It was sold to the Village of Green Island in 1979. But this left the 115 year old white marble altar to be used for public hearings. Because parishioners did not want that to happen, they requested Trinity Church of Lansingburgh, St. Mark's mother church, to dispose of the altar. Trinity Church offered the altar free to any church who wanted it with an additional gift of \$1,000 for moving it.

Since St. Mark's Church had been designed by Emylan Lyttel, junior architect to Richard Upjohn, the designer of St. Peter's Church, both churches had the same architectural design and style. It was felt that St. Mark's altar would complement St. Peter's Church.

The altar was moved in 1980 and now sits in the east isle of St. Peter's Church, in an area called St. Mark's Chapel. Both Reverend Bruner of St. Peter's Church and Reverend Donald Gardner of Trinity Church were pleased with the move. The altar was dedicated at St. Peter's Church in June 1980.

During Reverend Bruner's era, Paris Northrup, Dr. Bruner's secretary, conceived the idea of making the mosaic floor symbols on the east side of the church into hanging banners. When the project was complete there were banners mostly depicting each of the various mosaic floor symbols. These included Lions, (symbols of strength); an Anchor, (a symbol of stability); a Ship, (a symbol of the church); a Pelican, (a symbol of redemption); the Phoenix (a symbol of the resurrection); three fishes (indicating baptism); and a pair of stags, (symbols of constancy). On the back wall also is a government emblem, (a symbol of our nation).

This section of the church is devoted to quietness. It is used for a small Communion Service at noon on Wednesdays, for an early service on Sundays, and for daily quiet contemplation. It is an important part of the church.

Approval of the Vestry Meeting Minutes, April 9th, 2024

The vestry minutes from the April 9th, 2024 meeting were approved on a motion by D. Spath, seconded by P. Benson, then unanimously approved by the vestry.

Rector's Report - Mtr. Christina

Pastoral updates:

Led two sessions of St. Peter's Prayer School on healing prayer on April 10 and 14.

Led one session of the Prayer School on May 8 on prayer walking.

Concluded premarital preparation sessions with Jordan and Christianna and officiated their wedding on May 11.

Did one hospital visit and two nursing home visits.

Led prayers at the wake for Earl Stafford on April 24 – services will be scheduled at a later date.

Participated in increased singing during Morning Prayer on Sundays in Eastertide.

Worked to get temporary emergency housing for a family in May.

Organized and began Zoom Morning Prayer on May 10 as part of St. Peter's Nine Days of Prayer from Ascension to the Eve of Pentecost.

Celebrated the Eucharist in observance of the Ascension of Christ on May 9.

Have concluded preparatory instruction with our three confirmands, who will be confirmed on May 16 at St. Peter's.

Doing the groundwork to see what would be required for a web redesign.

Working on hiring an "Ambassador" from the City Mission to work the door on Sunday mornings and help with our Safety team

Opened the church during opening ceremonies of the Tulip Festival on May 10 (along with Daniel and Emerson), chatted with visitors, and handed out bottled water.

Visited Siena College on May 2 and had breakfast with one of the friars and one of our parishioners.

Attended a de-escalation training on May 14 put on by Albany Downtown BID and Albany PD.
