Beloved of God,

What words do you know "by heart"?

As a kid, I had to memorize my "times tables" in grade school to learn multiplication. I recited poems by Robert Frost and William Ernest Henley. And, I learned Scripture. The 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm (King James Version, of course). Verses from Philippians and John's gospel and more. I'm sure some of you have your own list of things you had to commit to memory.

Isn't it interesting that the idiom for memory work is to learn words "by heart" instead of "by head"? Obviously, we're drilling the words deep into our brains so that they stick. But, to learn "by heart" acknowledges a deeper truth: words that we commit to memory make an imprint upon us, especially the holy words of Scripture. These Spirit-breathed words – once memorized – can be carried anywhere and can come to mind right when we need them in moments of fear, temptation, sorrow, doubt, and even joy.

Learning "by heart" can be intimidating, but I can tell you that it's worth the effort. Memory work is something even young children can do. And at St. Peter's this fall, our kids are going to be our leaders.

Starting on Sept. 8, we're going to embark on the St. Peter's ABCs Bible Memory Challenge. This challenge was inspired by a viral YouTube video of a 4-year-old Texas boy named Tanner Hemness, who rattles off 26 Bible verses – one for every letter of the alphabet. (You can easily find the video online – I highly recommend it because it's both inspiring and adorable).

Every Sunday, we'll have our memory verse of the week printed in the leaflet. And at the start of 10:30 am service, I'll call our children up front to go over the verse and to talk over it (think of it as a reconstituted children's sermon time). If a child can recite a month's verses for me from memory, I'll track it on a reward chart.

And did I mention ice cream? A month of verses earns a Stewart's gift card for a frozen treat (and yes adults, I'll give you ice cream too, if you can memorize all of these – I'll be trying myself!). If any of our kids can recite all 26 verses in March when the Challenge ends, a Grand Prize will be awarded.

Will you try to meet this challenge with our kids? If you learn some or all these 26 Bible verses "by heart," I think you'll be surprised by the way God uses them to speak into your daily life.

See you somewhere between "A" and "Z"!

# Walking with Peter

## Adult Education beginning in September

There are symbols and images of the Apostle Peter throughout our church: in the chancel windows, in the mosaic floor, even on the cover of the weekly leaflet. They are part of our shared history as a parish family; an artistic backdrop to our weekly services; a silent witness to our baptisms, weddings, and funerals. We have grown accustomed to looking at them, but do we really see them? Are they simply beautiful pieces of art, or do they have a deeper spiritual significance for our parish and for each one of us as disciples of the Lord?

Using these symbols and images as points of reference, in this study we will closely examine the events of Peter's ministry as revealed in the Scriptures and historical documents of the faith, and together we will explore how his life – like those glorious windows in our chancel – can shed light on our own journey.

**Beginning September 8**, we will meet at 12 pm on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday (and occasionally the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday) of each month for about 45 minutes.

# From the Archives

# The Church Narthex

The north side of the Narthex of the 3<sup>rd</sup> edifice of the church contained a baptismal font of an earlier date. It was directly below Henry Holiday's stained glass window depicting the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist with the inscription underneath reading, "This is my beloved son in whom I am well pleased." The Baptismal Font was of white marble and very ornate. It contained the inscription "He shall gather the lambs with his arms." The placing of the font followed the early tradition that baptism preceded entry into the church.

The font was moved to the front of the church during the rectorship of Laman Bruner when a mosaic floor plaque was created in the floor. It was created to honor Dr. Bruner by his wife, friends and family. for 25 years of rectorship. The mosaic banner reads as follows:

This Tablet is offered
In thanksgiving
for the Ministry of
Laman H. Bruner Jr. M.Div, D,D., JU d, LAD
Honorary Canon, Chaplin New York State Assembly
By His Wife, Children and Friends
On the occasion of the twenty-fifth Anniversary
Of his call to St, Peter's Church in 1952 as its
Twentieth Rector

On the wall beside the floor plaque there is a cabinet of wood paneling holding replicas of the Queen Anne Communion Silver. On the wood paneling are the names of those who served in the world wars and poems in their honor. Also on the West Wing of the Narthex are two plaques: one for the Rose Window and its lancets, given by Sarah Talcott Pruyn, and one for the outside Stone Cross given by John De Witt Peltz, Vestryman,1896.

In the east end of the Narthex is a War Chapel of oak paneling. Above it are stained glass windows of David and St, Michael. All of this was contributed by Arthur Stein in honor of his son Arthur Stein Jr. who was killed in the Second World War. During the war, prayers for loved ones fighting in the war were offered at the War Chapel. The Columbarium holding the ashes of deceased members are stored in the east wing of the Narthex, as well two important wall plaques, of white stone, one for John Tweddle whose bequest and family contributions made possible the tower, and Elizabeth Brandt Wilson wife of Orlando Meads, Church Warden, 1861 to 1869.



## Pastoral updates:

Led first session of St. Peter's Prayer School class "Riches of the Prayer Book" on Sunday, June 9.

Did one home visit and two nursing home visits.

Did last rites for Fred Hershey on June 5.

Concluded St. Peter's Nine Days of Prayer and Morning Prayer on Zoom from Ascension to the Eve of Pentecost.

Celebrated the final Wednesday Eucharist before summer on June 5. We'll have noon prayer in the garden in the summer months and resume Wednesday services in St. Mark's Chapel in September.

Presented our three confirmands and served as the bishop's chaplain during the Regional Confirmation service held at St. Peter's on May 16.

Have begun work on redesigning our web page and am coordinating with our web team for a smooth transition once the new page is ready to go live. Will probably be working on it for at least another month.

Led Children's Chapel on Sunday, May 26.

Hired Juron Green to work with our Safety team on Sunday mornings.

Co-wrote and co-led a workshop at Diocesan Convention with John Davis titled "Morning & Evening Prayer: Tools for Lay Leaders."
