Beloved of God,

We're moving toward a special day this month. On November 24, we'll be observing a Celebration of Friendship Sunday and All-Parish Breakfast. And, you have the most important role in preparing for this day. You're in charge of the guest list.

Is there anyone in your life: a close friend, a relative or a neighbor who you'd like to invite to church for a delicious breakfast and a beautiful time of worship that reflects on friendship with God and others? (A special blessing on friendships will be a part of the services that day).

Our plan is to have a Sunday especially focused on welcoming visitors to St. Peter's. If you've considered inviting a friend who is looking for a church or someone who is un-churched, this is one of the best Sundays to do it. We'll be doing everything possible to make your guest feel welcomed, including the All-Parish Breakfast at 9:30 that will provide delicious food for everyone who comes between our 8:30 and 10:30 am services. We'll also still have coffee hour after the 10:30 service for those who want to come later.

November — if you think about it — is a month that celebrates many different kinds of friendship. It begins with All Saints' Day (Nov. 1), a special reflection on the great stories of heroes of our faith. The next day is All Souls' Day, which sometimes gets combined with All Saints. It's a day to remember the faithful saints in our own lives who have passed into larger life.

But November is bookended with Thanksgiving and Christ the King. At Thanksgiving, many of us gather with either family or friends (or both) to share a festive meal and to give thanks to God for his faithfulness. And that leads us to Christ the King, the end of the church year and an acknowledgment that Jesus — our King and our friend — sits in glory on his throne, and his reign has begun.

Part of being a Christian is being a friend. We find friendship with God, and that friendship extends to others in the family of faith. I know that many of you enjoy decades-long friendships here at St. Peter's that have shaped, upheld, and enriched your lives. We want to invite others into that love — to welcome them into friendship with us and with Jesus, who is the love who holds us all together.

This past week, we heard this reading from Sirach in the Daily Office:

- 14 Faithful friends are a sturdy shelter: whoever finds one has found a treasure.
- 15 Faithful friends are beyond price; no amount can balance their worth.
- 16 Faithful friends are life-saving medicine; and those who fear the Lord will find them.
- 17 Those who fear the Lord direct their friendship aright, for as they are, so are their neighbors also.

So many people in our city are hungry for this kind of friendship. Loneliness is rampant in our culture, despite how pervasive technology is in connecting us in perfunctory ways. Although they experience relentless connectedness, people long for friendships that have honesty, generosity, steadfastness, and love. We'll be reflecting on each of themes during Sunday sermons this November as we consider what friendship is supposed to look like in the family of faith and what it means to us.

I'd ask you to begin now to prayerfully consider who you will invite to our Celebration of Friendship Sunday. Remember that your invitation won't only satisfy your friend's hunger with a good breakfast. It could potentially satisfy a much deeper hunger that only God can fill.

Memorial Service Scheduled for Col. George Munro on 267th anniversary of his death

At 6 pm on Saturday, Nov. 2, there will be a memorial service at St. Peter's Church honoring Col. George Munro, the unsung hero of Ft. William Henry who died in 1757 in Albany. Col. Munro is interred at St. Peter's alongside Lord Howe. The service is the capstone of a day of learning titled "The Siege of Fort William Henry, 1757: Friends, Foes and Danger in the Wilderness." 
Pre-Thanksgiving Dinner at St. Peter's

From the Archives

Welcome to St Peter's Church



St. Peter's Church is a historic edifice. It was the first house of worship of the Anglican Communion north of New York City and west of the Hudson River. It's beginnings are rooted in the history of the English settlement of the territory, with the first services held in 1712 and the first edifice opened for worship on November 25, 1715. The second edifice was designed by Richard Hooker and was built in 1803, and the third and present edifice, was opened in 1859. It was designed by Richard Upjohn and was designated by Congress as a National Historic Landmark in 1980.

The church contains duplicates of the original Queen Anne silver, a gift given to the early church by British Governor Hunter, (the original silver is stored in a safe location). The church also contains the burial vault of British Lieutenant General Viscount Lord Howe, as well as the vault of Colonel Munro. The flags above the church nave are those of the colonies that were represented at the early meeting, the Albany Congress in 1754.

Episcopal worship is focused on the Bible, including the Old Testament, the Psalms, and the New Testament. These readings are listed at the Lectionary at the back of the Prayer book, ensuring that much of the Bible and the Psalms are read in years A, B and C. The liturgical colors follow the church year, with white signifying Christmas, Easter, marriages and funerals; purple for Advent and Lent; red for Pentecost and ordinations; and green for ordinary times after Epiphany and Pentecost. On Good Friday, as we remember the crucifixion of Christ, the altar is stripped and crosses are covered in black cloth.

Worshippers traditionally kneel for prayer and for receiving Holy Communion. Worshippers stand to sing hymns, to sing the chants and to recite the Apostles Creed. We stand when the alms are brought to the Altar. We sit for instruction, including the sermon and for music by the choir or organ. To show our devotion, we may bow to the cross or make the sign of the cross before or after the service.

Approval of the Vestry Meeting Minutes, August 13th, 2024

The vestry minutes from the August 13th, 2024 meeting were approved on a motion by D. Spath, seconded by M. Lundberg, then unanimously approved by the vestry.

Rector Report - Mtr. Christina

Pastoral updates:

- 1 Did planning/scheduling for Christian education/outreach programs that kicked off this month.
- 2 Officiated a burial service for Margaret Dickson (a parishioner's aunt) at a funeral home on Aug. 26.
- 3 Concluded leading Noonday Prayer in the Garden that met most Wednesdays in the summer.
- 4 Participated in the first "Walk with Peter" class that began on Sept. 8 an adult education course that I'll co-teach with John Davis throughout the academic year.
- 5 Began our ABCs Bible Memory Challenge program for kids (and adults!) on Sept. 8.
- 6 Resumed the fall Wednesday worship schedule in the church with a celebration of Holy Communion on Sept. 4.
- 7 Led the Vestry retreat at Christ the King Center on Sept. 7.
- 8 Ongoing work with music department for chorister recruitment efforts and for organizing a "Come and Sing Evensong" event for a weekend in October or November.
- 9 Organizing St. Francis Day Animal Blessing and Hot Dog Roast Benefit for Oct. 4, with half of proceeds going to benefit the PAWS program of the Damien Center.
- 10 Continuing work on Narthex Revamp and updating some of our promotional materials for that area.
- 11 Continuing work on our web redesign.
- 12 Will be adjusting my office hours this fall to allow me to assist in homeschooling my daughter this year. I'll be teaching her on Thursday mornings, but we'll probably be in the church office most Thursdays so that I can get some office work done while I assist her with her schoolwork. I'm also moving my weekday off for the rest of 2024 from Monday to Tuesday (I promise to still come to Vestry meetings).

In an effort to continue our budget reduction efforts, the vestry voted to eliminate 2 of our 4 spots that we currently rent on a yearly basis across the street. This vote was made on a motion by M. Lundberg, seconded by J. Russom, then unanimously approved by the vestry.

New Business -

There was a conflict with the updated date for the November meeting. The Vestry has voted to change the November meeting to Tuesday November 19th.

Moses Kamya attended the meeting and presented to the vestry about the US-Uganda Orphans Education Fund. St. Peter's outreach has been sponsoring yearly scholarships to this organization for many years.

The vestry voted to increase the Assistant Organist stipend due to the increased responsibilities M. Moran has taken on. This vote was approved on a motion by D. Spath, seconded by W. Pettit, then unanimously approved by the vestry.

Adjournment

A motion to adjourn was made by C. Gordon and seconded by M. Lundberg, then was approved unanimously by the vestry.
