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Program Description

Cambridge College offers travel and learn courses devoted to the exploration and development of knowledge and skills in different learning sites outside the continental US. The Ecopsychology course requires that students make a commitment to both, the onsite session before travel, travel objectives of the course and after travel assignments.

The Ecopsychology course is designed as an interdisciplinary course. As such, we will learn about economics (the US economy and its trends, environmental economics, consumerism, economic globalization and sustainable development) and psychology (Gestalt Psychology). Guided and instructed by Dr. Pedro O. Schuck, Professor Marcos Carvajal and visiting faculty from Puerto Rico, the course offers fieldtrips to forests, Guanica Beach, the town of Maricao, the fish hatchery and waterfalls - combined with class sessions.

Students will complete readings about cultural conditioning and myths, economics, and psychology. In addition, students will read about these topics in relation to Puerto Rico. Drawing sessions will facilitate the learning of mind mapping skills to summarize course concepts and experiences.

During the pre-travel session, students will get to know each other, work around issues of team work and group dynamics and will be oriented about Puerto Rico and logistics for the trip.

Every day brings news of human beings' impact on the life-support system known as Earth. But what is the truth behind the headlines? In 1999, an international group of more than 70 scientists analyzed the condition of the five ecosystems on which all life most heavily depends — freshwater, agriculture, forests, grasslands, and coastal ecosystems. Their findings are the scientific basis for Earth on Edge.
- An Introduction to Ecological Economics** 45m
Gaylord Nelson, Herman Daly, and John Cobb, Jr. go to the heart of the complaint by pointing out the staggering costs of traditional, neo-classical schemes for economic growth and development. In Herman Daly's words: "We can no longer treat the earth as if it is a business in liquidation!" Gaylord Nelson's first 10 minutes in this tape are brilliant. His revelatory analysis of the devastation wrought by traditional industrial practices in the forests of Siberia as well as in the oceans off Japan are second to none. Daly and Cobb's 'Index of Sustainable Economic Welfare' is discussed, along with a rousing, humorous condemnation of consumerism and the need for a global 12 step program to kick the habit. Gaylord Nelson closes by emphasizing the importance of teaching environmental concepts to coming generations.

WHERE ARE WE STAYING?

San Juan

The arrival and departure nights in the program will be spent in San Juan. Our accommodations for these nights will be at Hosteria del Mar. It is ten minutes from the airport and minutes from Old San Juan and Plaza Las Americas (the largest mall in the Caribbean). This ocean front beach house setting puts you one step from the beautiful white sandy beach. Get to Hosteria early on arrival day so you can enjoy an afternoon at the beach!

Maricao

Our rain forest site is in Maricao, a region located 40 miles from the capital of San Juan in the southwestern mountains of Puerto Rico. Maricao is known for its lush and exotic flora and fauna. The small town of Maricao, set amidst the Monte del Estado Forest, is bordered by exquisite tropical landscapes of gardens and ponds and is home to the famous Maricao Fish Hatchery. Maricao's stone observation tower provides distant views to the Caribbean Sea and the Mona Passage.

Our classroom sessions and accommodations in Maricao will be at Hacienda Juanita, a restored 19th century coffee plantation located high in the cool, tropical mountains of Maricao rain forest (1700 ft. above sea level; average temperature of 72). Juanita offers comfortable rooms with private bathrooms, dining-in varandas overlooking the forest, a local arts and crafts store, tennis court, swimming pool and nature trails with a variety of tropical flora and fauna and spectacular bird-watching opportunities.
