Community Donations Power New Courthouse Christmas Tree

Christmas Spirit is on its way to the Kerr County Courthouse

September 5, 2025—The Kerrville Christmas Lighting Corporation (KCLC), a local 501(c)(3) nonprofit, is honored to announce that a brand-new 50-foot Christmas tree is officially on its way to the Kerr County Courthouse lawn, ensuring Kerrville's cherished holiday tradition will continue to shine bright. With this addition, Kerrville will proudly maintain its title as home to the tallest Christmas tree in the Texas Hill Country.

Earlier this spring, **before the flooding**, KCLC retired and sold the aging 45-foot tree that had graced the courthouse lawn for the past 13 years due to persistent lighting issues and other wear and tear. At that same time, KCLC launched a fundraising campaign to secure a new tree. Unsure if the goal could be met, the nonprofit paused for a time—but ultimately took a leap of faith and placed a deposit, determined to preserve this symbol of joy and tradition.

Now, more than ever, our community needs light and hope. With so many families and businesses impacted by this summer's disaster, the tree will stand as a reminder of resilience and togetherness.

The new courthouse tree, made in the USA, will:

- Feature nearly 37,000 warm white LED lights—more than ever before
- Stand 5 feet taller than the original, thanks to a new riser and star topper
- Operate on upgraded 120V power to enhance lighting performance and reliability

"We know the last few months have been unimaginably difficult," said George Eychner, KCLC President. "Our hope is that this new tree will bring some much-needed cheer to Kerrville this Christmas, lifting the spirits of all who gather at the courthouse."

Privately Funded Through Community Support

KCLC emphasizes that this project is **funded 100% by private donations**—not by the City of Kerrville, Kerr County, or taxpayer dollars. The organization is a **100% volunteer-run nonprofit made up of local citizens**, dedicated to keeping Kerrville's holiday traditions alive. KCLC relies solely on the generosity of individuals, families, and businesses in the community to bring the Christmas season to life.

The project is currently **80% funded**, with just the final stretch left to raise. Contributions help cover the costs of the current project, future expansions, and ongoing maintenance—supporting a brighter Christmas in Kerrville for years to come.
