Demand for Justice in the Murder of Ashlee Jeanee – Tanzania

To Whom It May Concern,

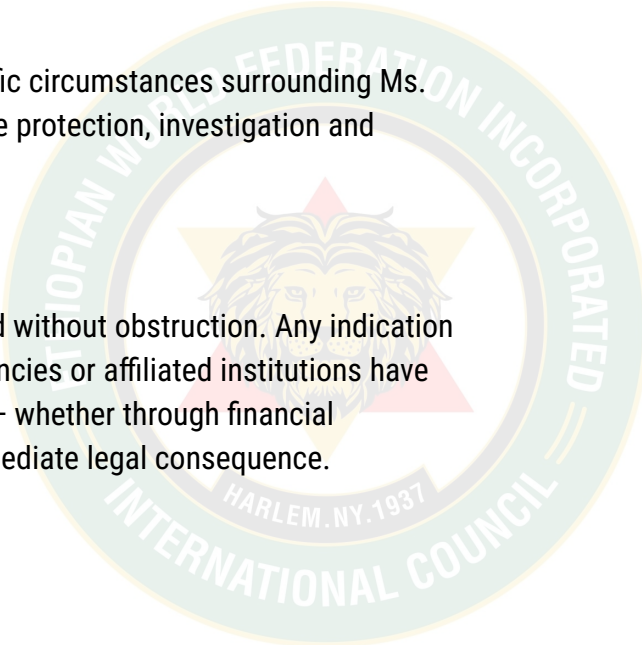
The Ethiopian World Federation, Incorporated (EWF), writes with grave concern and an unambiguous demand for accountability regarding the tragic and deeply troubling murder of

Ms. Ashlee Jeanee in the United Republic of Tanzania.

This matter raises serious questions not only about the specific circumstances surrounding Ms. Jeanee’s death, but also about broader systemic failures in the protection, investigation and representation of American nationals traveling abroad.

Demand for Justice and Transparency

EWF asserts that justice must be pursued fully, impartially and without obstruction. Any indication that individuals within governmental bodies, investigative agencies or affiliated institutions have been influenced, bribed, silenced or otherwise compromised – whether through financial inducement or coercion – must be treated as a matter of immediate legal consequence.



No individual or entity, regardless of status or position, should be shielded from scrutiny. Any attempt to suppress evidence, manipulate reports, or delay proceedings undermines both international legal standards and the foundational principles of justice.

Accountability of Associated Individuals

Given the seriousness of this case, EWF calls for a thorough and independent investigation into all persons closely connected to Ms. Jeanee prior to her death. This includes, but is not limited to, her fiancé, Mr. Joe McCann, whose proximity and potential knowledge of relevant circumstances necessitate formal examination under appropriate legal protocols.

Additionally, any individuals or networks suspected of participating in, facilitating, or concealing criminal activity including but not limited to participation in human trafficking must be identified and held accountable under applicable domestic and international law.

Concerns Regarding Safety of Americans Abroad

This case highlights a broader and urgent issue: the lack of adequate safety infrastructure, emergency response systems and medical access for American citizens traveling internationally.

EWF calls for:

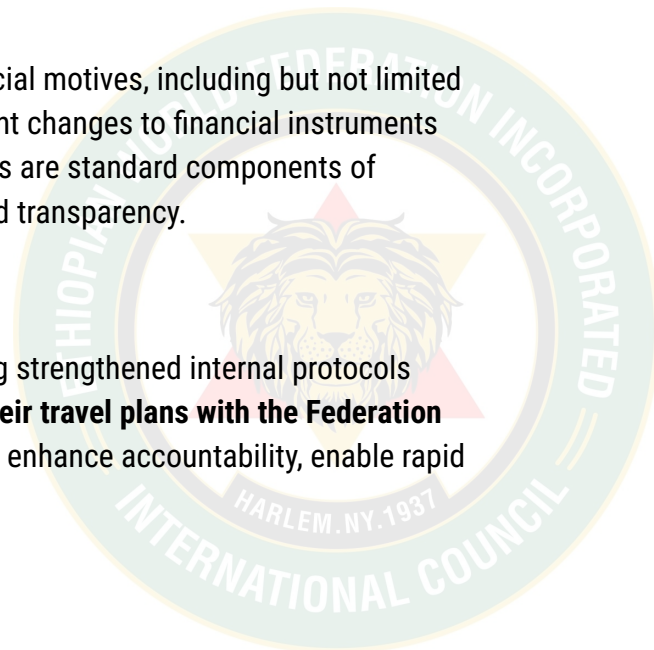
- Strengthened bilateral protocols ensuring immediate and transparent communication between host nations and U.S. authorities in cases involving American citizens.
- Improved access to emergency medical care and crisis response services for Americans abroad.
- Mandatory reporting standards and oversight mechanisms to prevent investigative irregularities.

Potential Financial Motives and Insurance Concerns

EWF further urges investigators to examine all possible financial motives, including but not limited to life insurance policies, beneficiary structures, and any recent changes to financial instruments connected to Mr. Joe McCann and Ms. Jeanee. Such elements are standard components of homicide investigations and must be addressed with rigor and transparency.

Community Responsibility and Preventative Measures

In response to this and similar incidents, EWF is implementing strengthened internal protocols requiring all members traveling abroad to **formally register their travel plans with the Federation Headquarters prior to departure.** This measure is intended to enhance accountability, enable rapid



response in emergencies and ensure a structured support network for members operating internationally.

We strongly encourage broader adoption of similar frameworks across diaspora and civic organizations. If you need administrative assistance to strengthen your organization with these frameworks contact our International Headquarters.

Conclusion

The loss of Ashlee Jeanee cannot be met with silence, delay or procedural negligence. Justice in this case must be visible, measurable and uncompromised. EWF stands firmly in its commitment to advocating for truth, accountability and the protection of all individuals under international law.

We call upon the relevant authorities in Tanzania, The United States of America and any involved international bodies to act decisively and transparently.
