Who is Feed More WNY?

FeedMore WNY is the nonprofit formed by the merger of The Food Bank of WNY and Meals on Wheels for WNY. They partner with 371 hungerrelief agencies and programs in Chautauqua, Cattaraugus, Erie and Niagara counties. This includes the food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters and other agencies in our member network. It also includes partner home-delivered meal sites in Erie and Niagara Counties and congregate dining sites in Erie County. In 2021, FeedMore WNY provided 12.8 million meals to hungry Western New Yorkers. The demand for their services has significantly increased because of the pandemic. Charity Navigator, a charity evaluation site, gives FeedMore four stars and rates it 98/100 (for every dollar, only two cents go to administrative overhead).

Through their food bank distribution network, they assisted a total of 173,100 individuals in 2020, including 70,971 babies and children, 78,161 adults and 23,968 seniors.

A total of 54,152 households were served through their food bank distribution network. In 2020, they delivered 1.3 million meals to 5,535 homebound neighbors in Erie and Niagara counties through home-delivered meals program. They provided another 65,444 meals to 2,000 mobile seniors through our congregate dining program.

The pandemic has significantly increased the demand for their services. We are being called to aid our community!

During the 2022 Lenten season St. Paul's will be conducting a food drive to assist programs administered by FeedMore of WNY (www.feedmorewny.org). We are asking willing congregants to bring one or more of the food stuffs listed below to St. Paul's between March 6 and April 24. After the 24th, representatives from FeedMore will collect the donations and provide them to needy WNY residents.

- ·Canned tuna or chicken
- ·Canned soups, stews or chili

- ·Boxed Mac and Cheese
- ·Pasta and rice
- ·Spaghetti sauce
- ·Baby food and diapers

2022 Social Ministry Calendar

March/April

•Food drive – We will work with representatives from FeedMore (www.feedmorewny.org) again collect non-perishable food items. This food is used to help those with food emergencies and for use in their Meals on Wheels program. Last year we gathered over five 50-gallon barrels of food.

May

·Support congregants who participate in Autism Walk on May 14

Planning for a community garden will be developed and, weather permitting, started.

June

Chivetta Chicken Barbecue – On June 10 we will host a Chivetta Chicken Barbecue, similar to prior years. Proceeds will be donated to a local non-profit chosen by Council. In the prior years over \$1k has been donated.

Organize volunteers to work with Sleep in Heavenly Peace. This organization builds beds for children in need. Volunteers 12 years old and older are needed to build or deliver beds. Williamsville has a local chapter. Their website is (www.shpbeds.org).

·Work on community garden

September

·Clothing/diaper/baby bottle drive – Gather clothing items for children (infants to six years old); diapers for newborns and sizes 4,5, and 6; and baby bottles. All material will be donated to Harvest House (www.harvesthousebuffalo.org). Last year this effort was an overwhelming success. Harvest House was able to immediately use our donations to assist Buffalo's new Afghan population.

October

Spaghetti Dinner – Assuming Covid has declined enough, we will reprise our annual Spaghetti Dinner. In prior years almost 100 meals were served. Proceeds are donated to a local non-profit chosen by Council.

November

·Turkey donations – congregants will be asked to either donate frozen turkeys or fund the purchase of turkeys. The church provides turkeys and funds to Friends of the Night People (www.friendsofnightpeople.com).

·Soap, toothpaste fund raiser – work with local homeless shelter to provide toiletry items

for shelter residents.

December

·Annual Christmas Book, Hat, Scarf and Mitten fund raiser – Books, wool hats, mittens, scarfs and school material will be gathered and provided to a Buffalo elementary school. This is an annual church effort.
