

Rías Baixas (Galicia)

Located in the region of Galicia in Spain's NW Corner, Rías Baixas abuts the Atlantic Ocean and is separated from northern Portugal by the Mino River. It's cool maritime climate which yields heavy annual rainfall gives the verdant region its nickname "Green Spain".

Originally cultivated by the Romans who brought viticulture to Galicia, Albariño has been grown on the banks of the Umia and Mino rivers for over 1,000 years.

Bodegas As Laxas

The winery was acquired by the Simon Ferro family in 1975, but had been producing wines from the Condado de Tea sub-region of Rías Baixas since 1862. Over time the family's holdings have grown from 1 hectare to 60. Today, the winery is run by 4 of the Simon Ferro children.

Alvinte Albariño Technical Notes

Grapes - 100% Albariño fermented in stainless steel

Alcohol - 12.5%

Total acidity: 5.8g/L

The estate vineyards are mostly over 30 years old and are planted on south-facing granite terraces between 500 and 650 feet.

Tasting notes

Clear, brilliant wine with an extremely elegant lemon-yellow color. An intense aroma on the nose with persistent aromas reminiscent of green apple and tropical fruit (pineapple) lingering on the palate with perfect acidity harmonizing with the medium body of the wine. A wine full of sensations.
