The company has recently learned that several employees have received suspicious, unsolicited telephone calls from individuals seeking information relating to the company. While we do not know the sources of allthese calls, health care companies have been the target ofphishing scamsthat try to get employees to disclose sensitive information. Health information in the wrong hands can be profitable information.

We encourage you to remain vigilant and urge you to take the following precautions:

- Do not reveal personal or financial information in response to unsolicited calls or emails.
- Do not respond to telephone or email solicitations for this information from an unknown source.
- Verify a caller's identity before providing personal information.
- Avoid clicking on links in unsolicited emails.
- Be wary of email attachments. Do not open an unexpected email attachment without first confirming the e-mail is authentic (call the sender).
- If a message contains an unusual request, does not sound like the sender, or contains incorrect details, confirm the content with the sender by telephone.
