While sitting at the circulation desk, personal use of the library computers is prohibited. Please do not check your personal email, social media accounts, play games, or chat online. If your friends are in the library, please leave the front desk area before socializing.

If you have special talents, skills, or interests, please let us know. It would be helpful in providing us with ideas on how to best fill your volunteer time. For example, please share if you have web design skills, computer knowledge, musical ability, or an artistic flair.

Please choose and maintain a consistent schedule so we can provide a meaningful volunteer experience. Please call the library if you are unable to meet your volunteer obligation.

Teen volunteers earning community service hours must sign in and out for each visit. Unrecorded volunteer hours will not count towards community service time.
