

VILLAGE OF PERDUE
BYLAW NO. 4, 2000


A BYLAW TO REGULATE OPEN FIRES WITHIN THE VILLAGE LIMITS.

The council of the Village of Perdue in the Province of Saskatchewan, hereby enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw the following definitions shall apply:
 - a) "Chief" shall mean the Chief of the Volunteer Fire Fighters of the Village of Perdue or such other person who may be appointed by council to carry out the provisions of this bylaw.
 - b) "Council" shall mean the Council of the Village of Perdue.
 - c) "Open Air Fire" shall mean any fire intentionally lit on private property for the enjoyment of the property residents.
 - d) "Outdoor Fire Appliance" shall mean a device designed specifically for the purpose of burning charcoal or seasoned wood.
 - e) "Village" shall mean the Village of Perdue
2. The site of the burning of open air fires and burning Outdoor Fire Appliance must be inspected and a permit (Schedule "A") obtained from the Village of Perdue prior to an open air fire being ignited.
3. Open air fires shall not be set unless the following measures are taken to limit their spread:
 - a) Fires must be contained in a non-combustible Outdoor Fire Appliance constructed of cement, brick, or sheet metal with an 18 gauge thickness,
 - b) The Outdoor Fire Appliance must have a bottom and four sides or 360° round,
 - c) The Outdoor Fire Appliance's maximum inside measurements shall be 60 centimeters by 60 centimeters or 60 centimeters in diameter,
 - d) The Outdoor Fire Appliance's maximum height/depth shall be 65 centimeters,
 - e) The top of the Outdoor Fire Appliance must be completely covered by a 10 millimeter wire mesh,
 - f) A fireguard of noncombustible material 60 centimeters wide must surround the Outdoor Fire Appliance,
 - g) the Outdoor Fire Appliance must be a minimum of 4 meters from any building and 6 meters from any property line, unless written permission to do otherwise is provided by the fire Chief.
4. Open air fires shall not be permitted in any front yard.
5. The fuel for open air fires may consist only of charcoal or cut, seasoned wood. The burning of all other materials is prohibited.
6. A person to whom a permit has been issued under section two (2) shall ensure a competent person is in attendance to prevent the fire from getting beyond control, or causing damage or becoming dangerous.
7. Open air fires must not be set in windy conditions conducive to creating a running fire or a nuisance to another person.

8. Any open air fire which causes an unreasonable interference with the use and enjoyment of another person's property shall be extinguished immediately.
9. The Fire Chief may, when conditions warrant, post a ban on all open fires, including cooking fires, with the exception of those cooking fires made with charcoal and enclosed in a sturdy metal container designed specifically for such a purpose, or those cooking fires made with an approved propane or natural gas burning appliance.
10. Open air fires shall not be allowed prior to 11:00 a.m. All open air fires shall be extinguished no later than 11:00 p.m.
11. The Fire Chief shall, at all times, have access and authority to inspect an Outdoor Fire Appliance and determine the compliance with the bylaw in the matter of care and control of an open air fire.
12. Nothing contained in this bylaw shall relieve any person from complying with all relevant laws, regulations or bylaws, and in particular, with the provisions of *The Clean Air Act, 1989* as amended and revised from time to time, and *The Fire Prevention Act, 1992* as amended and revised from time to time, and the regulations passed pursuant thereto.
13. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the Village of Perdue.
14. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of approval of third reading by Council.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS/CONDITIONS:

1. Open air fires shall not be set unless the following measures are taken to limit their spread:
 - a) Fires must be contained in a non-combustible Outdoor Fire Appliance constructed of cement, brick, or 18 gauge metal;
 - b) The Outdoor Fire Appliance must be covered with a heavy gauge metal mesh with openings not exceeding 10 millimeters.
 - c) The fire must be monitored continuously by competent individuals to keep it well under control.
 - d) A garden hose, extinguisher or other method of extinguishment must be available at all times.
2. The Village of Perdue assumes no responsibility for any burning or consequence of any burning. The owner is responsible for all damages which may occur as a result of burning. The owner may be required to extinguish the fire at any time if it causes unreasonable interference with the use and enjoyment of another person's property.
