Objectives and Activities.

St Andrews PCC has the responsibility of co-operating with the incumbent in promoting in the Ecclesiastical parish the mission of the church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has maintenance responsibilities for the church building. The church membership, the Warden and PCC all being part of the wider benefice ,works in conjunction with the other parishes of the benefice.

Achievements and Performance.

Church Attendance

There are 29 parishioners on the Church Electoral Roll all but 2 resident within the parish. The average attendance counted during October 2014 was 5 but this number this increased at festivals.

Review of the Year.

The PCC met 4 times during the year with average attendance of 70%.

The service schedule provides a joint Benefice service on the first Sunday of the month, the location moving round the benefice. On the remaining Sundays of each month St Andrews had either Holy Communion with Hymns, Worship for All or Evening Praise.

There has been 1 Wedding and 2 funeral services.

Fabric.

The organ, fire extinguishers and clock have all had their annual maintenance

The churchyard is kept tidy and mown and the small conservation area maintained. We are very grateful for the continued work of Roy Haynes in maintaining the churchyard to such a high standard.
