In September there was an introduction to the story of Captain Harry Reynolds, who was born in Whilton and who won the Victoria Cross in 1917. In November the subject was The Water Gardens of Brockhall in the 18th and 19th centuries.

January was the time for eating, when we enjoyed hotchpotch and apple cake, followed by a hotchpotch of questions about Whilton's history. In March the title was "The Mills on the Stream: stories of Brockhall, Muscott and Whilton Mills."
