



Event Continuity Planning

An Event Continuity Plan (ECP) is a strategic approach that brings departments together to create a transparent process, including:

- Project initiation
- Risk assessment
- Strategy development
- Plan development
- Emergency communications
- Awareness/training and coordination with public authorities

The ECP outlines actions to be taken during and after a disaster, and the process to follow in their recovery to normal operations.

The goals of an ECP should include:

- Create an Event Continuity Committee (ECC)
- Determine the ECC scope and objectives
- Specify the goals of your program
- Establish an emergency management process

An ECP is process that identifies potential threats to an event. It provides a framework for resilience and a response that reduces risk to the stakeholders, reputation and activities.
