WHAT IS THE PIT COUNT?

The Homeless Point-in-Time (PIT) count is an unduplicated count on a single night of people in our community experiencing homelessness. These counts help us plan services and programs to address local needs, measure progress in reducing homelessness, and identify strengths and caps in the current homeless crisis response system.



HOW CAN I VOLUNTEER?

Volunteers can participate by surveying individuals experiencing homelessness. Volunteers must be 18 years of age, have access to a smart phone or tablet, and attend an in-person or virtual training.
