This Indenture, made the thirty first day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty two (1882) Between William Dickey and Mary A. his wife of the Township of Rose, County of Jefferson and State of Pennsylvania, of the first part, and Samuel C. Moore, of the Township of Millstone, County of Elk, and State aforesaid, of the second part. ~~Witnesseth~~; that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Thousand Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America, to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have remised released and quit claimed, and by these presents do remise, release and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, all that certaine one undivided third part of all the three following described tracts or pieces of land situate in the Counties of Elk and Jefferson, and State of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows. Viz; That certain tract of land lying and being in Millstone Township, Elk County and State aforesaid, surveyed on Warrant No 2542, situated on the waters of Big Tobys Creek in the last purchase district No 5, bounded and described as follows. Viz; Beginning at a white Oak corner on the District line No 6; thence East Four Hundred and Thirty perches to a post; thence west Four Hundred and Twenty eight perches to a Hemlock corner on the District line No 6; thence south Three Hundred and Thirty perches to the place of beginning, Bounded on the south by tract No 2533; on the east by tract No 2545; on the north by tract No 2540; and on the west by District line No 61 containing Nine Hundred and Twenty Acres and Two or perches with the usual allowance of six per acre. Also, a certain other tract of land, situate in Millstone Township in the County of Elk and same State as aforesaid, surveyed on Warrant No 2545, bounded and described as follows. Viz; Beginning at a white Oak corner being a corner of this and the adjoining tract No 2542; thence East Four Hundred and Forty four perches to a white Pine corner being a corner of this and the adjoining tract No 2528; thence North Three Hundred and Thirty perches to a Welsh corner; thence West Four Hundred and Forty four perches to a post; thence South Three Hundred and Thirty perches to the place of beginning, Bounded on the south by surveyed land; on the East by tract No 2528; on the North by tract No 2515; on the west by tract No 2542, containing Eight Hundred and Sixty Two acres and Nineteen perches, with the usual allowance of six per acre. Also a certain other tract of land situate in the Townships of Heath and Millstone, in the Counties of Jefferson and Elk and State aforesaid, surveyed on Warrant No 2533, bounded and described as follows. Viz; Beginning at a White Oak; thence by lot No 2542 East Four Hundred and Twenty four perches to a post; thence by Vacant land (or formerly so) South Three Hundred and Twenty perches to a post; thence West Four Hundred and Seventy four perches to a white

and leave bring same lands Conveyed by James McAdam and wife  
and Samuel P. Large and Isaac A. Large by Deed recorded in  
County in Deed Book Vol. Pages, and same Conveyed to  
the present grantor by H.C. Owyler, Sheriff of Elk County by Deed  
Recorded in Said County in Deed Book Vol. page. Nevertheless  
excepting and reserving out of the above described three tracts  
of land all pieces or parts thereof heretofore Conveyed, or contrac-  
ted to be Conveyed by Article of Agreement, And also, excepting  
and reserving thereout such rights and privileges of entering  
upon said lands for the purpose of exploring and boring for oil  
(which lands have been heretofore contracted for by lease or  
otherwise to the "Millsboro Oil Company" or to others.  
Together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments  
and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise ap-  
pertaining, and the reversions, remainders, rents issues  
and profits thereof. And also, all the estate, right title, interest  
property, claims and demand whatsoever, as well in law  
as in equity, of the said parties of the first part, of, in or  
to the above described premises, and every part and parcel  
thereof, with the appurtenances, To have and to Hold the said  
undivided one third part of the said three hereinbefore men-  
tioned and described tracts or parcels of land, nevertheless,  
excepting and reserving as hereinbefore reserved, together  
with the hereditaments and premises hereby granted or  
mentioned and intended so to be, with the appurtenances unto  
the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns
