Last Year's Deficit Turned into a Surplus

After being more than a \$600,000 in the red last month and projecting an ultimate \$300,000 plus deficit, the district's 2024-25 budget is currently in the black, though they're still awaiting some invoices. One reason for the surplus is the new True Time timekeeping system, which allows staff to use comp time for extra hours instead of getting paid overtime.

Kyle from Nexus gave an update on the referendum construction projects. He reported work is going on as planned as they flip from demolition to the finish phase. Work is 55% complete with all bids coming in slightly under budget. The elementary school addition has been started with the new 4K area to be finished by winter break so that students may move in



Referendum constructon project well underway

The Brodhead School District referendum construction projects are well underway. If you have driven past any of the schools within the district, you have definitely noticed all the major construction taking place. As a result of the community's support of the \$17.5 million dollar referendum in April of 2024, the District was able to use those funds for major capital improvements and updates across the entire District. Prior to the Wednesday, July 9 Regular School Board Meeting, School Board members were led on tour of the construction projects by Kyle Robers, the Referendum Project Manager from Nexus Solutions. It is an exciting time for the Brodhead School District. These additions and updates will ensure our buildings are in great shape and will provide the students of Brodhead with great facilities and opportunities for years to come.
