Local Election Update: City of Brodhead Poll Books Going Digital

Beginning with the next election, voters will notice a change at our local polling place: paper poll books are being replaced with Badger Books, a secure electronic poll book system.

Badger Books allow election workers to check in voters using a computer/tablet instead of a paper list. The system is designed to make voter check-in faster and more accurate while maintaining the same voter eligibility rules and safeguards already in place.

For voters, the process will feel very familiar. You will still check in at the poll table, state your name and address, and show photo ID as required by law. Your ballot and voting options remain the same, and no voting history is stored in the system.

Election officials emphasize that Badger Books are secure, used only for voter check-in, and do not connect to voting machines or the internet while polls are open.

Voters with questions about the new system are encouraged to contact their local election office or speak with a poll worker on Election Day.

Antiques: Q&A, Tuesday, February 10

Everyone is invited to bring in an old article, be it an antique or a collectible, to learn more about it at this Antiques: Q&A event. Perhaps it is a family keepsake or maybe something picked up at a garage sale or a thrift shop. No matter its history, bring it in and Jay Friberg, a retired antique dealer with more than 20 years of experience, will be glad to offer information about the piece. Please join us at 7 p.m. whether you bring an item or not.

This is a great chance to learn exactly what the item is and how it was used. Don't worry whether your piece is an "antique" or a "collectible"—all these old pieces remind us of how our ancestors lived before the great changes in lifestyle brought about by the availability of electricity, running water and central heating.

The term "antique" comes directly from the French language and means simply "old." Decades ago the federal government declared that an item which is more than 100 years old would be considered an antique and therefore could be brought into the country duty free. That age is still relevant and of course some antiques easily exceed 100 years. Then there is the term "vintage" not as old as 100 years but also valued for its age and appeal.

Collectibles are items, which are, as the name implies, things people might want to collect because they are appealing and interesting in some way. Many collectibles reflect what appears to be a simpler time in decades gone by. With the rapid change in how we live today, charming articles from years ago often seem quaint and collectible to younger generations while older folks might remember them as simply everyday items.

The monetary value of an item is always important to the owner and that can vary with time. For those who watch older Antiques Road Show programs, the monetary value, i.e. the amount someone might be willing to pay for an item, can decline over time. Although Jay is not an appraiser, he will offer a rough assessment of a piece's worth.

This program is hosted by the Friends of the Durand Library, a nonprofit 501c3 group, which collaborates with the school to provide library services to the community.

Residents of the school district can check out books from both the school and the Durand Library collections. Check out period is three weeks and renewals can be made by phone or email. Regardless of residence, everyone is invited to all library programs and events.

Library services are free and easy to use and the Friends urge the community to support and use this local effort. Please email villagelibrary@cusd322.org or call 815-289-8602 with any questions. Library hours are Saturdays 9 a.m.-noon and Tuesday evenings 6-8 p.m. Entry to the library is at the east end of the school, follow the signs along the wide paved walkway.






