UW-MADISON ANNOUNCES FALL DEAN’S LIST

The Wild Ones Rock Valley Chapter presents Sara Dykman: Bicycling with Butterflies on Thursday, January 19, at 7:00 p.m. The Zoom link is: https://bit.ly/Wild-Ones-Jan-2023

In 2017 Sara Dykman became the first person to bicycle the entire route of the migrating monarch butterfly. She traveled from Mexico to Canada and back on an old mountain bike weighted down with all the supplies she would need for nine months on the road. Along her 10,201-mile route, Dykman gave presentations to people about the monarchs and what people could do to protect the migration. She became a voice for the monarchs. Now her voice has the potential to travel even further, with the launch of her book, Bicycling with Butterflies. Part science, part adventure, part love letter to nature, Dykman hopes her book will inspire people to see the beauty of our own backyards and the power each of us has to be part of the solution. Sara Dykman is the founder of beyondabook.org, which fosters lifelong learners, boundary pushers, explorers, and stewards. She works in amphibian research and as an outdoor educator, guiding young people into nature so they can delight in its complicated brilliance. She hopes her own adventures—walking from Mexico to Canada, canoeing the Missouri River from source to sea, and cycling over 80,000 miles across North and South America (including the monarch migration trip)—will empower young and old to dream big.

2022 Tax Assistance Appointments

Appointments for free income tax preparation services for low to moderate income, elderly and disabled persons through the AARP Foundation/ Tax-Aide programs will be available beginning Monday, January 16, 2023. Assistance provided includes the preparation of federal and state (including homestead) income taxes. Appointments are available in Monroe on Mondays and Tuesdays beginning Monday, February 6th from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Green County Government Services Building, N3152 State Road 81, Monroe. Please call the ADRC at 608-328-9499 to schedule an appointment beginning Monday, January 16th. Enter at the ADRC entrance at the lower level parking lot. There will not be appointments available in Brodhead this year due to staffing issues.


At your appointment time, you will complete an intake interview in person at the site. Your documents will then be scanned by the counselor and given back. Preparation of the tax return will be done remotely. You will then be required to make a second appointment on Friday of the same week to review and sign the return in person.

Bring your photo ID, social security card, last year’s tax returns, Forms W-2, SSA, 1099, 1099R, 1099G, brokerage statements and self employment records. Additional documents include mortgage interest; medical/dental expenses (including Form 1095A and insurance premiums); charitable donations; and sales, income and property taxes. We cannot prepare returns with self-employment if any apply: there are employees, losses, expenses that exceed \$25,000, depreciation or business use of home.

For homestead credit, bring the above documents and also a copy of your real estate tax bill or an original rent certificate signed by your landlord. If you are age 62 and under, are disabled and have no income, you must also provide written proof of your disability.

Boys' Basketball Need to Regroup

Brodhead dropped both games last week with the first taking on the Evansville Blue Devils. The Cardinals struggled to get many of their shots to fall through the hoop. While the Blue Devils trio of Aiden Maves, Kole Johnson and Grayden Geske were a triple threat from long range and down under. Cullen Walker was the player for the Cards that was generating consistent action. He scored half of Brodhead's total points, including three trays, to lead all scorers with 24 points. Jaxon Dooley with 11 points was the only other Cardinal player with double digits. Leading Evansville to a 71-48 victory was Maves with 23, Geske with 17 and Johnson with 16 points.

In game two, the Cardinals were on the road to Edgerton. The Crimson Tide would take control early putting nine points on the board before Brodhead's Dooley would drop one in for two. At the half the Tide were leading 50-23. The deficit was too much for Brodhead to overcome. The Cardinals managed just three 3-point shots on the night while Edgerton had four players who combined for thirteen from long range, 10 of them were accounted for in the first half. Brodhead made 6-of-17 from the stripe.

Brodhead did have eight players recording points for the game including Dawson Blum closing out the Cardinal scoring by drilling a three-point shot. Nathan Engen led Brodhead with 13 points on the night. Edgerton, with 24 points, was led by Preston Schaffner. This week Brodhead will be home on Thursday against Big Foot.
