District Moves Forward with Facilities Referendum

Al Schneider expressed concern that there may be another increase in the tax levy resulting in another tax increase apart from what would result from passing the referendum. He stated he didn't want Brodhead to be in the same situation as Monroe where they presented the best-case scenario to taxpayers only to find that costs and their levy increased. After discussing that the levy increase was mainly due to increases in state per student allowances, increased property values and changes in enrollment that likely won't happen again. Mike Krupke worried that this referendum could impact the operational referendum the board will need next year. Elizabeth Kempel mentioned students have commented on the condition of Brodhead's restrooms compared to other schools. Superintendant Novy highlighted the importance of keeping up the facilities to attract students while Michael Oellerich stated the community expects secure facilities and full-time 4K in Brodhead as in surrounding districts. After reviewing favorable community survey results and discussing the implications of "kicking the can down the road again" if they don't act, the board

decided to go forward with an Tuesday, April 2nd Referendum requesting approval for \$17,485,000 for facilities updates including secure entrances, space for fulltime 4K and updated windows and bathrooms among other improvements.

Principal Kelly Knox and guidance staff Ethan Anderson and Miranda Ends presented the results of the Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) they have implemented using grant funds to support mental health and Social and Emotional Learning (SEL). This year funds were used to hire Miranda Ends. This allowed them to, among other things, proactively teach soft skills to all students instead of having to wait until students have issues. Knox expressed this is especially important post-pandemic as Covid conditions caused delays in SEL and motor skills.

In other business:

Safety Drills took place Thursday, January 4th in all schools.

Cameras have been updated to catch blind spots.

Dr. Lisa Semrow, Middle School Principal and Director of Curriculum and Instruction, will retire in June after 24 years of service.


