City Council

What is happening at City Council this month?

This month the Council has met twice and will be meeting again this week. During the Monday, January 9th meeting the Council approved the appointment of Erin Menzel to the Library Board.

The Council was also presented with the proposed referendum question for the 2023 April Election. Treasurer Miller presented the Department of Revenue approved resolution for a \$400,000 referendum question. Treasurer Miller informed

the Council of the projected effect of the \$400,000 increase to the tax base of the city residents. For Green County residents, it would be an increase of \$172 per \$100,000 of assessed value (14.33 per month) and for Rock County residents would be an increase of \$196 per \$100,000 assessed (16.33 per month).

Alder Baxter felt if the Council is asking for a referendum there needs to be a five-year plan put in place as a guide for future Councils.

The grant funding this year was used to purchase a Welch Allyn Spot Vision Screening device. This is an electronic vision screener that can be used to detect potential vision challenges in children and will be shared by the schools in Green and Lafayette Counties. Having access to a vision screening device allows for students with a higher risk for vision deficits, such as children with Down Syndrome or Cerebral Palsy, to have vision screening completed on a more routine and timely basis, in order to prevent vision loss or secondary disability associated with visual deficits. The device also allows the district to complete vision screening during completion of special education evaluations and during 4K and Early Childhood Screenings. The Brodhead School District would like to sincerely thank The Arc of Green County and The Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin for their generosity and their ongoing support to provide for the needs of local children.



2022 TAX ASSISTANCE APPOINTMENTS

Appointments for free income tax preparation services for low to moderate income, elderly and disabled persons through the AARP Foundation/Tax-Aide programs will be available beginning Monday, January 16, 2023. Assistance provided includes the preparation of federal and state (including homestead) income taxes. Appointments are available in Monroe on Mondays and Tuesdays beginning Monday, February 6th from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Green County Government Services Building, N3152 State Road 81, Monroe. Please call the ADRC at 608-328-9499 to schedule an appointment beginning Monday, January 16th. Enter at the ADRC entrance at the lower level parking lot. There will not be appointments available in Brodhead this year due to staffing issues.

At your appointment time, you will complete an intake interview in person at the site. Your documents will then be scanned by the counselor and given back. Preparation of the tax return will be done remotely. You will then be required to make a second appointment on Friday of the same week to review and sign the return in person.

Bring your photo ID, social security card, last year's tax returns, Forms W-2, SSA, 1099, 1099R, 1099G, brokerage statements and self employment records. Additional documents include mortgage interest; medical/dental expenses (including Form 1095A and insurance premiums); charitable donations; and sales, income and property taxes. We cannot prepare returns with self-employment if any apply: there are employees, losses, expenses that exceed \$25,000, depreciation or business use of home.

For homestead credit, bring the above documents and also a copy of your real estate tax bill or an original rent certificate signed by your landlord. If you are age 62 and under, are disabled and have no income, you must also provide written proof of your disability.

Alder Gritzmaker felt the \$400,000 number was proper considering the CPI and rising operating costs of the City. He expressed concern about having an ongoing levy increase and how future Councils will use them.

Alder Simpson agreed with Alder Gritzmaker's concerns over an ongoing tax levy increase. Alder Simpson said that if this referendum does not get approved, the Council will need to look at areas to cut from the budget. Alder Simpson said he would like discussion of 911 dispatch and the court system to be brought up in February or March meetings to be discussed as future areas to be cut.

Mayor Jones explained to the Council that the reason for the referendum was to cover the increase of the City's operating costs. It is highly unlikely that the operating costs will ever decrease. A sunset tax (expiring tax) will force the Council to go back to the voters when the tax ends and then ask for an even larger amount. If that one doesn't pass, then you are in an even more grave position than we are now.

Alder Gritzmaker asked the Council if they would be willing to do a referendum for one year, 2024.

More discussion concerning many of the same points were had by Council members and Doug Pinnow, a member of the Finance Committee. Please check the City of Brodhead website for the full minutes of the January 9, 2023 meeting.

In the Mayor's report, a sevenday notice was given for Mike King to join the Water and Light Com-



The term grade-point average (GPA) requirement for University Honor Roll is 3.3; the term GPA requirement for Dean's List is 3.75 out of a possible 4.0.






LORAS COLLEGE ANNOUNCES FALL 2022 DEAN'S LIST
