



All across the landscape, steeples of churches large and small point skyward, indicating the place where men, women, and children have gathered-often for generationsto give thanks for their victories, weep over tragedies, and walk together through the mundane rhythms of life. The walls of those sacred spaces are saturated with prayers offered to the God of the universe, who sent His Son to die so they might live. They are forever imprinted with the hopes and dreams of people who gather week after week, no matter the weather, because something deep in their souls requires them to come together.

Those churches are dwindling in numbers now, as they have for years in Europe. Christians have not often lived up to their callings, and we have been judged harshly for that. We did it to ourselves, I believe, but that's a subject for another discussion.

My point is that, in Brodhead and elsewhere, churches are filled with communities of people who continue to persevere because we cling to the God who lifts us, enables us, blesses us, corrects us, and remains faithful to us even when our behavior might not be flattering. We are not always good emissaries of the Lord we serve, but we're striving to do better. Meanwhile, we're taking care of homeless families, feed-

ing hungry people, responding to needs quietly, and praying fervently for people who may never know it. We do that because we are filled with joy, and we love the people around us with the love of God.

If you haven't already, I pray you'll find connection with a community of faith and join your heart with the hearts of your neighbors and friends. Don't worry about money, or whether you'll fit in. You don't have to sing, or give a speech. This is about connecting with the Lord, alongside others who are connecting with the Lord. It's about praying alongside others who are praying, and being with others who long to be with you.

The next time you're out driving, and you see one of those steeples poking out above the treetops, remember-there gathers a community of people filled with joy, angst, grief, and hope, all shoulder to shoulder striving to make the world a bit better in Jesus' name. Most of them are not picketing, insulting, denigrating, or demeaning others. They want sick loved ones to get better, and young people to be safe in the world. They want to grow and be better themselves. Most of all, they want to feel the presence and peace of God.

Take a moment and join them this Sunday.

2022 Tax Assistance Appointments

Appointments for free income tax preparation services for low to moderate income, elderly and disabled persons through the AARP Foundation/ Tax-Aide programs will be available beginning Monday, January 16, 2023. Assistance provided includes the preparation of federal and state (including homestead) income taxes. Appointments are available in Monroe on Mondays and Tuesdays beginning Monday, February 6th from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Green County Government Services Building, N3152 State Road 81, Monroe. Please call the ADRC at 608-328-9499 to schedule an appointment beginning Monday, January 16th. Enter at the ADRC entrance at the lower level parking lot. There will not be appointments available in Brodhead this year due to staffing issues.

At your appointment time, you will complete an intake interview in person at the site. Your documents will then be scanned by the counselor and given back. Preparation of the tax return will be done remotely. You will then be required to make a second appointment on Friday of the same week to review and sign the return in person.

Bring your photo ID, social security card, last year's tax returns, Forms W-2, SSA, 1099, 1099R, 1099G, brokerage statements and self employment records. Additional documents include mortgage interest; medical/dental expenses (including Form 1095A and insurance premiums); charitable donations; and sales, income and property taxes. We cannot prepare returns with self-employment if any apply: there are employees, losses, expenses that exceed \$25,000, depreciation or business use of home.

For homestead credit, bring the above documents and also a copy of your real estate tax bill or an original rent certificate signed by your landlord. If you are age 62 and under, are disabled and have no income, you must also provide written proof of your disability.




