# SSM Health Gives Presentation on Staff Clinic

After Superintendent Novy and Finance Manager Robin Bye saw the concept in Edgerton, representatives from SSM Health were invited to advise the board on the benefits of having a dedicated staff clinic. Healthcare costs are rising to over \$24,000 per insured member. High deductible plans can be barriers to seeking care. A clinic would remove those barriers according to SSM Health. There would be a clinic in Monroe staffed by a Nurse Practitioner and a Registered Nurse. No claims would be filed for care received at the clinic, which should serve to reduce insurance premiums over time as well as reducing workers compensation claims, out of pocket costs and missed time. Only 22% of SSM Health members and 18% of Mercy Health members are currently keeping up with recommended preventative care. They have found incentivized preventative care helps identify problems before they turn into larger claims, which should decrease overall costs or at least slow the increase. There would be a \$20 copay for members on a high deductible plan for acute care and there would be a monthly charge per member to be paid by the district. If approved by the board this spring, the clinic could begin operations at the beginning of the next school year.

During the public comment period one district parent asked the board to consider educating students on the importance of uplifting Black History Month so that students can learn today for a better tomorrow. He has observed some teachable moments and believes relations are hindered if all students are not educated. Board members thanked him for his ideas.

# Green County Emergency Management Tornado Update

At approximately 5:12 p.m. on Thursday, February 8, an EF1 tornado (as determined by the National Weather Service) with estimated peak winds of 110 mph touched down six miles east of the City of Monroe and traveled in a northeasterly direction to approximately two miles southeast of the Village of Albany.

Several homes and one business on Trail Road, County Road E and Park Road had damage ranging from minor to major as a result of the tornado. There were no reported injuries or fatalities. There was originally 40–50 Alliant Energy customers without power after the tornado.

The Albany Fire Department, Albany EMS, Green County Sheriff's Office, Town of Decatur, Green County Highway Department and Alliant Energy responded to the scene immediately to render aid.

Green County Emergency Management conducted a damage assessment tour on Friday morning. This information has been forwarded to Wisconsin Emergency Management (WEM).

Three homes and one business sustained major damage from the tornado.

Several residents were unable to stay in their homes on Thursday night after the tornado and found temporary shelter.

Debris removal began almost immediately and continued as of Monday morning. Numerous volunteers helped with the debris removal. These efforts will continue for several days, if not several weeks.

Power was restored to all customers by Friday afternoon.







## February 2024 Meeting of the Monticello Area Historical Society

The Monticello Area Historical Society (MAHS) will meet at 7 p.m. Thursday, February 22 at Zwingli UCC, 416 E. Lake Avenue, Monticello. After a short business meeting, Michael John Jaeger, a volunteer with the Kelch Aviation Museum, Brodhead, will present a program on the "Airmail Beacons in Southern Wisconsin Fields."

Funny how cutting-edge technology becomes obsolete—and perhaps entirely forgotten—in the blink of an eye. You've seen airport radar equipment, used a GPS on your phone, and maybe even sent packages "by airmail"—but did you ever wonder just how these everyday conveniences came to be?

Modern day navigation and our understanding of getting from point A to point B was influenced heavily by the US Postal Service's beacon towers, one of which stands at the Brodhead Airport in southern Wisconsin, near the Kelch Aviation Museum.

Airmail was a critical component to the development of American aviation in the 1920s and 30s—but how, and why, did this affect rural towns and real people? 
