Approved Amendment to Fire District Agreement

At the Council's February meeting, the agenda was approved after discussion and clarification regarding items removed. There will be a future agenda item to develop a process for setting meeting agendas.

Tami Olszewski from Ehlers and Associates provided an overview of their Municipal Financial Management Planning Services. It was approved to engage them to advise the city on investing funds.

Mayor Jones advised the Council of plans to educate the public on the need for a referendum via Facebook, the newspaper and public meetings. An Ad Hoc committee will be brought together soon.

After Alders Simpson, Gritzmaker and Burkhalter expressed concerns over the valuation process, it was approved to bring Musser and Associates into the next City Council meeting. Alder Baxter suggested Alder Simpson provide questions in advance to make the best use of everyone's time.

Deputy Chief of Police Trevor Long reported he is stepping down to a part-time position for a position as a senior investigator for Wisconsin Lottery. He thanked the Council and the community and encouraged Council members to work together and seek input from department and other city employ-

Mayor Jones advised the work on the downtown lots where the buildings were razed is mostly done and the owners are weighing their options.

Outside work was approved for Dominic Wiegel. It was explained this won't interfere with his Parks and Recreation duties.

Changes to the Vacation Policy for new and existing city employees was approved to make the city more competitive.

The Finance Committee may solicit proposals for the appraisal of City owned property as requested by Alder Simpson.

Bill Pfisterer, a Brodhead native who graduated from Brodhead High School in 1960, has lived in Alaska most of his career as an educator. On this visit to Brodhead, Bill, an engaging speaker, will speak about his experiences amongst the Alaskan Indigenous People, and about the process of creating books that preserve their heritage and memories.


Bill and his wife Linda moved to Alaska in 1968 where they raised their family and Bill taught in remote native Alaskan villages. In his travels along the Porcupine River, and the Yukon River to the upper reaches including the Black River, he met interesting people who told their recollections of their native lifestyle in their own language, Gwich'in Athabascan. Bill's recordings of those visits were used in the Alaska Native Language Cen-

ter at University of Alaska, where they were transcribed into printed Gwich'in, and translated into English, resulting in two books.

Bill was also a professor at the many years. He was in charge of supervising the native student teachers, and was instrumental in having them learn and teach in the outlying villages instead of students being brought in to boarding schools and returned to their villages year later, which enabled them to remain immersed in their own cultural ways.

His two books are available online through the University of Alaska Mall Site, for \$15 each. These stories are presented in Gwich'in with English translations. People who wish to order them can find them at the website links below. Bill will be happy to autograph any books brought to the meeting.

CITY OF BRODHEAD'S 2023 APRIL REFERENDUM QUESTION

This referendum would allow the City to increase the tax levy for operating expenses for Public Safety, Public Works, Park and Rec, Library and EMS services. The question below will be on the April 4, 2023, Spring Election ballot.

Under state law, the increase in the levy of the City of Brodhead for the tax to be imposed for the next fiscal year, 2024, is limited to 1.182%, which results in a levy of \$2,031,620. Shall the City of Brodhead be allowed to exceed this limit and increase the levy for the next fiscal year, 2024, for the purpose of funding increased operating expenses such as Public Safety, Public Works, Park and Rec, Library and EMS services, by a total of 19.689% which results in a levy of \$2,431,620, and on an ongoing basis, include the increase of \$400,000 for each fiscal year going forward?

Coach Brian Kammerer could be heard from the sideline "we've got to take care of the ball" as his team struggled to maintain ball control. Kudos to the Hornets utilizing their height advantage to anticipate and deflect the pass generally taking possession. In the opening half Abbie Dix was held to four points. Addison Yates who was able to knock down a pair of treys and Taetum Hoesly battling for rebounds and putting up six points kept their team's playoff hopes alive. At the half Brodhead would be down by three-points. In the second half the Cardinals went to work stepping up their defensive presence and holding Richland Center to just 13 points. Offensively, Yates took a shot from beyond the key for three to tie the game. Alexis Kammerer put up a shot from long range followed by a layup to give the Cards the lead for good. Dix went to work in the paint scoring 12-of-16 in the second half. Yates would lead all scorers with 19 followed by Dix. Ella Johnson led Richland Center with 14. The 50-36 victory sent the Cardinals to Columbus for the regional semi-final on Friday.

A Tale of Two Cardinals

With both Brodhead and the Columbus Cardinals coming into this game with matching win-loss records, fans knew this would be a competitive game. In the opening minutes the teams were trading baskets for baskets. When one team would get ahead by two the other would soon tie the game back. It was all about defense and protecting the ball. Halfway through it would be tied at 18. After the break, Columbus had put together eight unanswered points. Momentum favored the home team. Dix was in the paint and got two, followed by Yates taking a shot for two more gave Brodhead renewed energy. "Klutch" Kammerer would put up a trey and Brodhead had a two-point lead with just under seven minutes to go. Then it would be Yates launching the ball from beyond the arc and Brodhead had a five-point lead. The Brodhead bench was on their feet cheering while the coach for Columbus called for a timeout. Columbus would come back and score eight unanswered points to regain the lead. Columbus was led by Alise Hayes and Jaiden Dornaus. Brodhead was led by Addison Yates—14 and Abbie Dix— 12. Wes Egan, 220, faced Damon Schmidt of Brillion. Schmidt would win by major decision. Egan is a sophomore with a 48–5 season record.


Both Brodhead and Parkview Albany have many wrestlers coming back next school year to pursue their goal of playing at the WIAA State Wrestling meet.

Brodhead jumped out to an early lead when they faced the Chiefs last week. With a five-point lead midway through the first half, Cullen Walker nailed a three-pointer and shortly after, Nathan Engen rebounded to go up strong for two more giving the Cards a 12-point lead. The Chiefs attempted a rally but with under a minute to the break, Walker would take a shot from long range and score. Gabe Bockhop would score two from the stripe and Brodhead clung to a 29-21 lead at the half. The second half saw Big Foot determined to right their sinking ship. Draining a pair of threes put them on track to come

within a single point. Coach Tommy Meier called for a timeout hoping to refocus his team and swing the momentum back to the Cardinals. Big Foot's defense limited Brodhead to five points in the first five minutes of the second half. The scoring would see-saw back and forth. Freshman Jayden Paul drained a three to give the Chiefs three-point lead. Bockhop would take his shot for a trey and tied the game at 40 all. Big Foot managed another three-point lead followed by two from the stripe. Attempted shots by Brodhead would rim out. The Chiefs gained as much as 10 points over Brodhead. Bockhop sank another three-point shot. Walker added 2 more and Brody Riese chipped in two from close

range. A charging call would negate a basket by Dooley and give him five $\,$ personal fouls. Down by nine, Sam Searls sank an outside shot for three but with under two minutes Brodhead needed to foul to save time on the clock. Big Foot would sink 6-of-9 free throws and seal their 62-52 win. Walker and Bockhop led the Cardinals with 14 and 13 points respectively.

In the final game of the regular season, Brodhead honored their three seniors prior to the start of the game. Aidyn Vondra, Kaiden Choinacki and Dawson Blum played their final game on the hardwood of Brodhead High School. Jefferson had the hot hand to start the game. Three-point shots by Cullen

Walker and Gabe Bockhop and rebounding by Brody Riese kept the Cardinals in range. Late in the first half, down by nine, Bockhop was solid on a trey from the perimeter. Jaxson Dooley went 2-for-2 at the stripe but rebounding and scoring meant the Cardinals were at bay from the Eagles with a 35-27 score at the break. Jefferson continued to control the game and had a 10-point lead midway the second. Bockhop swished another three-point shot while the Cardinal defense applied pressure to the Eagles. Dooley hit an easy fade-away jump shot from in the paint and then on a rebound he received a court long pass from Bockhop and put up two additional points. Brodhead was within three but that would be as close as the home team would get. Jefferson was paced by Finn Deblare with 19 points followed by Tyler

Schroedl—14 and Aidan Kammer with 10. For the Cardinals, Walker had 12 and Dooley 13 to lead their team. Jefferson rode home with a 57-48 victory.

Brodhead's post season play began Tuesday, February 28th when Brodhead #11 traveled to #6 Evansville. The winner will travel to take on #3 Platteville on Thursday.






