Brodhead School District to Present Referendum

On Wednesday, January 10, the Brodhead School Board passed a resolution to present a Referendum at the spring election on April 2. The Referendum seeks authorization from the residents of the Brodhead School District to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$17,485,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of District building and facility improvement projects.

Beginning in June of 2022, over 65 people, including members of our Board, administration, staff, teachers, and community members participated in the facility assessment process. Facilitated by Nexus Solutions, a firm specializing in assessing school facilities, our school team, produced a comprehensive

Facility Assessment, which identified over \$35 million in needs over the next 10 years. The Board approved a Long-Term Capital Improvement Plan, which helped our District determine what our facility needs are.

The Brodhead School Board made the decision to create a Facility Planning Committee to help determine the scope and dollar amount of this referendum. The Committee was made up of 25 members that met eight (8) times from last February through September to review our Long-Term Capital Improvement Plan, toured each of our schools, prioritized District needs, and developed a recommendation for the Board to consider.

District Substitute Teacher Pay Increased

To remain competitive with most other local school districts, Brodhead will increase substitute teacher pay for the 2024-25 school year. For one to nine days, pay will increase to \$125 per day and for ten days and beyond, it will increase to \$140 per day.

Long time elementary custodian Janet Schliem will be retiring at the end of May. Superintendant Novy and the board recognized her 20 plus years of service.

Novy provided an update on the communication strategy for the April facilities referendum. Upcoming communications consist of additional blog posts, weekly articles next month, YouTube videos, talking to the Chamber of Commerce

Thursday, February 29th and the Lions Club at the end of March, yard signs and information packets. Jennifer Flory noted that she's heard good feedback on the videos and Al Snyder said he hasn't heard anything negative about the referendum.

In other business:

Superintendant Novy gave the board an update on progress administrators have made toward their mid-year goals.

Due to rising restaurant prices, meal reimbursement rates were increased for the first time since the 2016-17 school year.

The board approved the revised Middle School Principal job description, which was updated due to Lisa Semrow's upcoming retirement.





School referendum

October 11, 2023, Board meeting. This recommendation included improved secure entries for all schools, upgrades to Elementary and Middle School bathrooms and windows, additional classroom space for an all-day four year-old kindergarten (4K) program, and renovations/additions to support a move of our fifth grade to the middle school. The Committee recommended an April 2024 referendum for \$17,485,000.

In December 2023, the Board initiated a randomized community survey of 400 Brodhead School District residents to gather feedback and determine if there was support for a referendum. The School Board reviewed the survey results at the January 2, 2024 meeting, which showed support for a referendum for the scope and amount recommended by the Facility Planning Committee. The survey suggested that:

•63% of our Brodhead School District residents felt these improvement ideas were a good idea.

•57% felt that \$17,485,000 was a fair price for projects being considered.

•56% would support a \$17,485,000 facility (bond) referendum.

This referendum will focus on three main areas: Safety and Security, Student Spaces, and Overdue Maintenance. Below is a listing of these items.

Safety and Security—Albrecht Elementary: secure entry with main office remodel; restructuring of grade levels to address building overcrowding

Middle School: secure entry with main office remodel; cafeteria expansion to address overcrowding

High School: secure entry with main office addition

Student Spaces—Albrecht Elementary: 4K addition allows the

District to accommodate and retain 4K students; 5K renovation for better space, needed bathrooms, and storage; main office remodel for student services

Middle School: fifth grade is moving to middle school building to balance populations of buildings, have appropriate classroom space, and allow for better learning opportunities; self-contained model for fifth grade; the same model as was served at the elementary school; classroom addition (Science, Special Education, Small Group, and Breakout Space); renovation for two sixth grade classrooms (in current band area); renovation for larger band classroom including practice rooms (in current receiving area); rafeteria expansion and kitchen/ receiving remodel

High School: student services renovations

Overdue Maintenance—Albrecht Elementary: original 1963 single pane window replacements; original 1963 bathroom updates, including ADA compliance

Middle School: entire building original 1958, 1968, 1985 window replacements; original 1958 and 1968 bathroom updates, including ADA compliance


