Green County Severe Storm Damage Reported

On Friday March 31, at about 7:15 p.m., Green County first responders, utility crews and emergency management personnel responded to reports of storm damage to at least 12 structures in the Decatur Township area. No injuries were reported, however one family was displaced due to home damage. Multiple outbuildings were damaged. As of 11 p.m. about 198 homes were still without power.

At about 7:15 p.m. powerful

Green County prompting a tornado warning. The storms damaged homes, barns, farm buildings and utility poles.

Residents discovering any storm damage who have not yet had contact with the Green County Sheriff's or Emergency Management offices are requested to contact Green County Emergency Management at 608-328-9416.

Tornadoes confirmed

Three tornadoes, two in rural Walworth County and one in the city of Beloit, were confirmed after damage observations done Saturday. Surveyors confirmed six more twisters across Green, Rock, Dane, Jefferson and Walworth Counties Sunday evening.
