New Mayor and Council members sworn in

The old Council met briefly to approve minutes. Retiring Mayor and Council members were thanked for their service.

New Council members took their seats, and the meeting was convened. Mayor Casey Jones and new Council members Jill Baxter, Ben Gritzmaker, and Paul Naramore

were sworn in prior to the meeting. Paul Naramore was elected Council President and Denessa Jones was chosen to remain on the Planning Commission.

City Council

The Council approved the Certified Survey Map dividing Parcel 2324.3 into two parcels. This is property south of Dollar General.

Ordinance 001-2022 approving a change in zoning from Highway Commercial to General Commercial for Rodriguez/Gospel Hall property, because it is for a church, was approved.

Mayor Jones read an Arbor Day Proclamation. Rich Vogel stated that the City has planted over two hundred trees since 2013.

In other business:

ARPA Fund requests for Pearl Island and the Brodhead Airport were referred to Green County Tourism.

Lori DeMario was appointed to the BID Board.

BID's annual plan was approved. The Council voted to decline a bid of \$5,050 on the old street sweeper. It will be relisted for sale at a later date in hopes of getting a higher bid.

Event approvals were granted for the Body Crafter Car Show on Saturday, June 4; a VFW Memorial Ride on Saturday, May 28 behind Deb's Bar; and the Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 30 from Veterans Park to the Cemetery.

One bartender license was approved.

The seven day notice for committees was as follows: Barb Krattiger to Public Works; Kassandra Huffman to Library Board; Becky Malkow and Melissa Kuebli to Park Board; Jaine Winters and Richard Peach to Plan Commission, and Peter Bernstein to Public Safety.

The resignation of Angela Noel as Library Director, effective Friday, June 17, was accepted.

Red Hot Pitchers Keep Softball Team in the Lead

It took all seven innings and, in the end, Brodhead softball had their first loss, 6–9, against Jefferson last Tuesday. The Cardinals were held to just four hits in the game while the Silver Eagles managed none. Ava Risum and McKenna Young were both on the rubber for Brodhead combining for 120 pitches and striking out nine players.

In the game against McFarland, Risum and Sophia Leitzen teamed up and pitched a shutout. On offense, the girls were smoking at the plate and put 11 runs on the scoreboard and completed the game in five innings. In the second inning, the Cardinals logged seven runs with Risum, Young, Sophia Leitzen, Madisyn Kail and Daisy Nelson getting RBIs. Leitzen and Young each had homeruns in the third.

They traveled to Whitewater on Saturday for a double header. In the first game Young, threw a complete game shutout, striking out 16, to help lead Brodhead to an 11–0 victory. The Cardinals racked up 13 hits for the day and gained five runs in the fifth inning. Cora Hafen, Young and Leitzen had multiple hits on the day. Leitzen hit deep in the fifth for a homerun.

Young continued her run on the pitcher's mound in the second game with another no-hitter and striking out 10 giving Brodhead, 12–1 score and the win. The visiting Cardinals gained eight runs in the fifth with Hafen, Kail, Nelson and Young contributing. Jerrica Schwartz and Hafen each went 2-for-2 at the plate.

Last Wednesday the Wisconsin Fastpitch Softball Coaches Association poll placed the Lady Cardinals in the No. 1 spot in Division 3. Also representing the Rock Valley Conference is Jefferson ranked seventh in D2.

This week the team were at McFarland on Monday and Clinton on Tuesday. They return to home on Thursday against Beloit Turner.

Jim Church Invitational Brodhead Girls first—Boys second

Eight schools competed in the Jim Church Invitational this past Friday.

The Cardinal women led all schools with 193 points while McFarland placed second with 119.5, Evansville with 85.5 placed fourth and Albany took sixth with 44 points. Other schools competing included Clinton, Big Foot, Black Hawk and Beloit Turner.

Stella Arn and Jada Burkhalter placed second and third in the 200m dash. Ellie Yates took first in 400m and long jump 15'9.5" and second, 32'11" in the triple jump. Kalaena Riemer placed first in 800m, while Addy Yates took first in 300m hurdles and second in the 100m hurdles. Brodhead took first in the 4x400m relay that was comprised of runners; Arn, Riemer, Madi Brown and E Yates. In field events, Brodhead continued with their triple threat trio of Kiara Moe, Onni Williams and Kirsten Fish again going 1-2-3 with the shot-out and Tori Urness added points with her third-place finish, 94'9" in discus. Taylor Midthun competing in pole vault came in second. Addy Yates, clearing 5'1" , also took first in high jump.

In the men's division, McFarland took first with 150 points while Brodhead placed second with 110, Evansville took fourth with 106 and Albany placed eighth with 22 points.

In field events, Blake Matthys, 42'3", and Gage Boegli, 41'4", took first and third in shotput. Josiah Engen finished with his 5'8" at the top in high jump. On the track Blake Senobe placed second in the 100m

On the mound for the count of pitches—strikes were Cooper Woelky 84-44 and Elliott 50-27, and combined for 10 strikeouts.

In game two both teams were scoreless until the Cardinals were able to score three in the fourth inning. Gabe Bockhop went 2-for-4 at the plate and had three RBIs. Malkow was credited with the win pitching six innings surrendering zero runs on three hits while striking out nine. Defensively the team had no errors in the field. Brodhead wins 6-3.

On Saturday the team had the opportunity to play at ABC Supple Stadium against Edgerton. This newly built stadium for the Beloit Skycarp, formerly known as Beloit Snappers, was a great setting for a ball game on a warm (finally) Saturday. Malkow was on the rubber pitching 5.2 innings, striking out nine while throwing 101-67 for pitches-strikes count. Edgerton was able to get on the board early with two runs in the first. The Cardinals struggled at the plate with Malkow, Elliott and Bockhop each going 3-for-1 in hits but no one crossed homeplate for a score. Edgerton with a 4-0 score comes out on top.

On Monday the team will travel to Jefferson, Whitewater on Tuesday, return to home on Thursday against Whitewater and then host a double-header on Saturday against New Glarus.


