Troy Nyman to Fill Vacant Council Position

After reviewing applications and interviewing four candidates, by a majority vote of the council, Troy Nyman was selected to fill the open seat left when Tom Simpson became mayor. His first monthly council meeting will be in June and his term will run through next April's election.

Leah Gaffney from Baker Tilly presented Brodhead's 2023 financial audit results to the Council. Compared to its peers, the city continues to be in good shape in all departments for both fund balances or reserves on hand and debt ratios. The city projected a balanced budget and came in approximately \$160,000 under budget due mostly to savings in police department staffing. The sewer department's operating expenses exceeded its revenue, but it had enough in investment income to cover the dif-

Police Chief Raupp reported, according to WE Energy, it will cost the city an additional \$1,059 to have

the gas meter updated to accommodate the new generator. Neither the contractor, PDC, nor the Engineers, MSA, have taken responsibility for the omitting it from the contract. After much discussion, it was determined regardless of fault, the work needs to be done soon so the Council approved paying for it with ARPA funds.

The council approved Chief Raupp to take Grant shifts if necessary. Grant shifts are overtime shifts paid for with state or federal funds for special projects such as speed limit enforcement in a certain area or time period.

In Other Business:

Allowing officers to help with Mutual Aid for Badger home football games was approved.

Public Works Director Vogel was approved to apply for a grant to update the 2011 inventory of city trees.


The Council approved recognizing the Pearl Island Trail as an official Recreational Area for the purpose of getting it on the county's maps, which will then allow people to find it online.






Jo Ann Binger

Jo Ann was born November 7, 1948 to Harold and Helen (Porter) Jennings, the oldest of four children.





Public nuisance declared. The Common Council finds that lawns, grasses and noxious weeds on lots or parcels of land within the City of Brodhead which exceed eight inches in length adversely affect the public health and safety of the public in that they tend to emit pollen and other discomforting bits of plants, constitute a fire hazard and a safety hazard in that debris can be hidden in the grass, interfere with the public convenience and adversely affect property values of other land within the City. For that reason, grass or weeds on a lot or other parcel of land which exceed eight inches in length is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, except for property located in a designated floodplain area and/or wetland area or where the lawn, grass or weed is part of a native landscape as defined in § 272.5A. This section does not apply to crops grown in conformity with the provisions of Chapter 480, Zoning, of the Code of the City of Brodhead.


