



The Green County Genealogical Society will hold its monthly meeting Saturday, June 3 at 10 a.m. in the second floor meeting room of the Monroe Public Library.

Where can data sometimes be found concerning individuals who are not well represented in the mass of available paper records? Grandma’s Privy! This presentation will show that not everything that went into privy holes, latrines, and out-houses was a mixture of . . . organic wastes. Into these holes went bones, bottles, toys, money, clothing, jewelry, dishware, cutlery, and watches among many other things; in fact, a wide variety of inorganic material which represents a full spectrum of the artifacts (articles of use) used by the people who made use of the privy.

“Hundreds and thousands of those privies, treasure troves of a variety of family artifacts, remain safely buried in both city and countryside. Using basic archaeological techniques, a minimally trained excavator can build from these artifacts both a picture of who deposited the materials, when they deposited those artifacts and how they lived. Information that cannot be found in paper records. Join them and learn.

Craig Pfannkuche is President of Memory Trail Research, Inc. since 1993, and is the Genealogical Archivist for the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad Historical Society since 1984. He is on the Board of Directors of the McHenry County, Illinois Genealogical Society and the Chicago Genealogical Society. He has presented numerous workshops in history, historical and genealogical research and archaeological techniques at both the local and national level.



Softball Advances to Sectionals

Brodhead softball team celebrated their regional title Thursday by beating Columbus in a 5-0 win. They started last Tuesday hosting Parkview in a regional semi-final. Coach Krupke utilized both his ace pitchers in each game. Makenna Young opened the games and pitched three innings with Ava Risum coming in to close out the final three innings against Parkview. Their pair tag teamed for 15 strikeouts, and allowed no runs. Kylie Stark was the losing pitcher for the Vikings. The Cardinals got their bats hitting in the first inning with four runs being scored and adding five more in the third. With two runners on, Young would hit a line drive to left field for a double that would also send Risum and Sophia Leitzen home. Young would then score on a wild pitch with Alexis Kammerer moving to third and Jaelyn Hilliard advanced to second. Alicia Dahl would get credited with an RBI with a single before the Parkview would get the third out. Top of the fifth, Chloe Mielke, Parkview, had an infield pop-out that was dropped by the Cardinal shortstop allowing Mielke to get on base. She would get caught stealing second with catcher Jada Schwartz firing the ball to Young who would get the tag out. Bottom of the sixth, Brodhead would be up 9-0. Leitzen is on base. Stepping to the plate, Taetum Hoesly who hits a long ball over the left field fence for a walk-off homerun to end the game 11-0 based on the 10-run rule. The Cards connected for 14 hits in the game led by Dahl going three-for-three at the plate and Hilliard two-or-two.

In the regional final, it was Brodhead playing host to fourth-seed Columbus who had beat out Lodi in a close regional semi-final. Coach K's team put together five runs in their first two innings which would carry Brodhead through to the end of the seventh for a 5-0 victory. Kammerer and Leitzen were each attributed with two RBIs. Again, Risum and Young combined for 16 strikeouts, no runs and no walks.

On Tuesday, Brodhead, playing at home, took on, third seed, Marshall in a sectional semi-final. The winner will advance to the sectional final that will be played at River Valley on Thursday.
