

POOL PARTIES

The Brodhead Pool will be available to rent for private pool parties. The cost for renting the pool is \$50.00 flat fee, plus the cost of paying lifeguards. Also, when you call, please have an idea of how large your party will be so we will know how many guards will be needed.

T-BALL SIGN UP

Boys and girls ages four, five and six may sign up at the pool beginning Tuesday, May 31st. T-ball is a beginning league that emphasizes learning of fielding, batting and base running skills with games added in starting week three and four. The cost for is \$30 for one session or \$45 for both sessions. The cost includes a T-shirt.

to bring an uplifting message to audiences with their newest production, "Right Before I Go" as part of the Colony Brands performance series.
