Softball Falls Short of Their Goal

Making their return to Goodman Diamond for the state semifinal game last Friday, Brodhead was challenged by the Prescott Cardinals. Coach Krupke has had Ava Risum, who has lead from the mound all season, struck out the first batter. Prescott's Rory Zuehlsdorf with an 0-2 count, tripled on a fly ball deep to right field but she would be left stranded as Risum took out the next two batters. With their first at bat, Sophia Leitzen, .556 avg, for Brodhead, put the ball in play to left field. Jaelyn Hilliard sacrificed to advance Leitzen to second base. Prescott's pitcher, Ella Stewart strikes out Risum and Leah Rear grounds out to end the inning with a 0-0 score. Prescott would score in the second to take a 1-0 lead. Brodhead defense would hold Prescott through the next two innings. Moving into bottom of the fourth, Rear, with a 2-2 count, singles with a fly ball to right field. Alecia Dahl flies out to the shortstop. Jerrica Schwartz would ground out to first base but Rear would advance to second. Tatum Ceslok would connect on her first pitch to send the ball to right field. As Ceslok lands on first, Rear celebrates as she scores for Brodhead to knot the game at one. Neither team would score in innings five and six. Top of the seventh, Prescott would have runners at first and third with one out. Brodhead intentionally walks Leah French to load the bases and give Brodhead opportunity for a force out at any bag. Megan Richter who was 0-for-3 at the plate hits a ball deep to center field for a double and is credited with three RBIs to give Prescott a 4-1 lead. With Brodhead feeling the pressure in this duel and one out, they get the bases loaded when Ceslock and Tessa Kloepping are walked, with Leitzen coming to bat. She sends a hard ground ball to center for a single. Hilliard, who normally bats from the left, changes it up and bats from the right but would strike out. Risum would fly out to left field to end the game. Brodhead's chance to move to the final round fell short of the team's goal.

Leitzen would lead in hits with 2-for-4 and Ceslok leads in RBIs. From the mound, Risum would strike out nine, walk two, giving up nine hits and four runs over seven innings. Prescott would move onto the state final game and beat Mishicot to claim the gold ball.

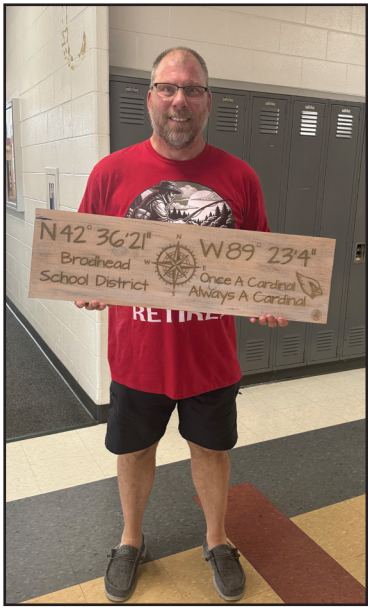

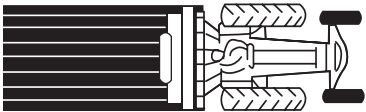
