

Viennese Fortepiano Virtuoso Daniel Adam Maltz to Perform Intimate Concerts at LincolnTallman Museum

Join the Rock County Historical Society for classical music featuring Viennese fortepiano player Daniel Adam Maltz as he performs in the historic Lincoln-Tallman Museum. Maltz is performing on Tuesday, July 25 at 6 p.m. and again on Wednesday July 26 at 1 p.m., in the museum located at 440 N. Jackson Street in Janesville.

Enjoy Haydn and Mozart's piano works performed as they intended them to be heard—in a historic home on a period instrument. Maltz tours extensively, traveling with his own replica of an Anton Walter fortepiano built in 1792. He will be performing on the main level of the Lincoln Tallman Museum, utilizing his background in historic performance to give guests an authentic 18th-century show. Seating is limited.

Maltz is a forte pianist based in Vienna, Austria. He is in demand worldwide with 50+ tour dates per year as a sought-after soloist, chamber musician, Lieder accompanist, and clinician. He also hosts Classical Cake, a podcast about Viennese classical music and culture.

Children will need to be accompanied by an adult during the camp-out part of the night (beginning at 5 p.m.). Please bring a tent and camping supplies for the overnight



Small Town Wisconsin Students Experience Culture Abroad

Last week, a local high school Spanish club from Monticello traveled to rural Costa Rica where they spent eight days immersed in local culture and Spanish language. In the 300-person town of La Flor, students lived with families and connected with local youth through a variety of intercultural and academic enrichment projects. One student commented that there was definitely some "culture shock involved. [We] lived in small houses right next to [our] neighbors who considered 9 p.m. bedtime, it took some getting used to." However, after a day or two of adjusting to the new schedule, students embraced the chance to spend mornings visiting the beautiful sights in their region, including waterfall hikes, biological reserves, and the Arenal Volcano, before returning in the afternoon to engage with locals.

Among these activities was a community library project whose goal is to encourage reading and facilitate access to books in an area where they are almost impossible to come by. Most evenings, students partook in exchanges with local teenagers, helping each other work on their language skills. Spanish immersion, in an area where only a handful of teens speak some English, was a major component of the trip: "I think I've picked up more knowledge here in a week than I did last semester," Inanda Senior.



BHS students take CNA Course

Our students will make wonderful CNAs! Many of our Brodhead High School students took the CNA course this spring semester. The students took the course through Blackhawk Technical College and the students earned college credits for the course. The class is a hybrid class which means coursework is done online and lab/clinical is done in person. The lab time was spent on campus in the lab/classroom setting and the clinical time was spent at SSM Monroe Clinic Hospital. Lab time was held in the morning and the students had to be up bright and early for clinical time starting at 5:45 a.m. in the morning! The instructor is Laura Powers, BSN; RN. She is a Blackhawk Technical College adjunct and the Brodhead School District Nurse. Brodhead High School had 10 seniors and one junior take the CNA class this year. Classes were taught at Brodhead High School campus, Monroe BTC campus, and Janesville BTC campus.

While in the lab the students practice a variety of different skills such as proper hand washing, infection control, proper body mechanics, range of motion exercises, donning and doffing personal protective equipment, taking vital signs, recording intake and output, bed making an occupied and unoccupied bed, positioning/transferring a patient, brushing teeth, bathing a patient, dressing a patient, and feeding a patient. They also learn the importance of having compassion and empathy for their patients. CNAs do a variety of skills while caring for patients and are an essential part of the healthcare team. CNAs not only provide physical care but also emotional and spiritual support, truly making a difference in

the lives of patients and families. CNAs are a vital part of the healthcare team.

Green County Leaders project installation

On Saturday, May 20th work culminated on a yearlong beautification project carried out by a team from the latest class of Green County Leaders. UW Extension and Green County Development Corporation cofacilitate the Green County Leader Program, which educates and inspires local professionals seeking to build their leadership capabilities. Working closely with Monroe Parks and Forestry supervisor Josh Trame, the team coordinated the planting of a native pollinator garden and completed a living tree catalog that highlights trees available through the City of Monroe Terrace Tree Program. The program offers Monroe residents trees for purchase that the city will plant, fertilize, mulch and guarantee for a year. Pollinator gardens feature a mix of native blooming plants that are attractive to and provide habitat for a diverse mix of bees and butterflies. Both components of the project can be found in Twining Park near the bandshell.

"This project was born out of the idea that trees and flowering plants make our neighborhoods a more attractive place to live. The emerald ash borer was devastating to many of our Green County communities, and we hope our efforts will serve as a resource for homeowners who want to participate in the Terrace Tree Program and those who are seeking inspiration for native plantings in their yards." says team member Matt Sheaffer. Matt was joined by Green County residents Al Aurit, Tim Lucas, Ashley Servin and Matt Schenk in the development and installation of the plantings.

Are you a Green County area woman interested in learning about conservation and meeting other women who share your passion for stewarding the land? You're invited to join a free educational session, "Learning Circle: Connect on Conservation," on Sunday, July 16 at 2 p.m. at Gasaway Gardens in Monticello, hosted by Renewing the Countryside (RTC), Soil Sisters and the Women, Food and Agriculture Network (WFAN) with a goal to bring women together with shared conservation interests and goals.

"These Learning Circles bring together women in a safe space to collaboratively connect, share and inspire each other," explains Jan Joannides, Executive Director of Renewing the Countryside, a non-profit dedicated to championing rural revitalization for over twenty years. "We have seen women thrive in such peer-based, informal learning environments, especially when we have the opportunity to gather together on a woman landowner's property and draw inspiration from her conservation actions, like Alicia Gasaway has done on her farm." RTC is the Wisconsin non-profit partner in WFAN's Stewardship Ambassador program, a seven Midwest state innovative venture supported by the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) to amplify the voices of women championing conservation practices on their land.

"I'm so excited to host this Learning Circle and share with other women what my family and I have created on our five acres. We are just beginning to learn about best practices for intensive grazing, cover cropping, permaculture, and raising animals. Finding an encouraging community that values knowledge sharing has been key for us. We've made lots of mistakes in our journey and admit our mistakes to others so they don't have to make the same ones" shares Alicia Gasaway of Gasaway Gardens outside Monticello. "I have personally found the support of and connections with other women who share my passion for stewarding the land through networks like Soil Sisters and WFAN so helpful, especially to share information and knowing I have others to call on for support and asking questions."

Gasaway serves as a WFAN Stewardship Ambassador, part of a team of over forty Midwest women farmers sharing their personal conservation journey story at various community events and gatherings like this Learning Circle. The Learning Circle format focuses on personal story sharing and resource connections in a safe, women-identifying only setting that welcomes all from beginners to seasoned conservationists.

"This WFAN Stewardship Ambassador project celebrates and spotlights these inspiring stories of women landowners, voices that historically have not been recognized in conservation," adds Stephanie Enloe, Director of Programming for WFAN. "Alicia exemplifies the incredible cooperative mindset of these women leaders, transparently and authentically sharing their land stewardship story with each other and strengthening opportunities for all by creating a supportive community."


Part of this local community roots in Soil Sisters, a project of RTC, which started in Green County over fifteen years ago to bring together rural women to share knowledge, resources and expertise to collaboratively advocate for conservation, sustainability, local food and networking. Featured on Around the Farm Table along with Midwest Living, Modern Farmer and a Top Rural Development Initiative Award winner, Soil Sisters brings the spotlight to the inspiring stories of women-owned family farms that produce food and fiber while stewarding the landscape. Today there are over 200 Green County area women in the founding group along with additional networks and resources.

This Learning Circle on Sunday, July 16 starts at 2 p.m. Free for all women to attend, but space is limited and registration required. Refreshments will be served. Attendees are invited to stay for supper at the monthly Soil Sisters potluck starting at 4 p.m., the monthly summer gathering bringing together this network of sustainability focused farmers, gardeners and local food enthusiasts in the Green County Area.
